In Memoriam



Everyone was saddened by the sudden and untimely death in June, 1966, of Mr. O. D. Duran, St. Clair County Superintendent of Education. To the students of Pell City High School, Mr. Duran was more than Superintendent—he was their friend and learned counselor.

Throughout his life Mr. Duran had been interested in education, leaving the United States Department of Agriculture to become a teacher in the St. Clair County system. His progression in the teaching profession cast him as principal of the Pell City Elementary School, Pell City Junior High, and, immediately prior to superintendency, the Pell City High School.

Mr. Duran would not desire that people over-mourn his death for he believed in life--the Christian life--and in living it fully, in helping his fellow man, and in serving his Master. It can best be said in Mr. Duran's own words, which we quote, from his message to the students of Pell City High School in the 1961 Pelmel: "It is my desire that the attitudes you have developed and the training received while in Pell City High School will enable you to live life to the fullest every day. Each person must live his own life in his own way, but a religious belief will help to overcome the heartaches in life. I hope that each of you will develop a sincere faith in God and an abiding trust in mankind. May God's blessings and mercy surround you in whatever vocation you choose."

Humbly, with reverence and respect, do we, the students of Pell City High School, enter this page in the '66 PELMEL as a lasting memorial to Mr. Orville D. Duran.




Proposed Junior Kigh and Gymnasium
