On June 28, 1965, the final plans for the erection of a new junior high school in Pell City were completed and approved by O. D. Duran, who was Superintendent of Education, thus seeing another of his dreams for education in St. Clair County no longer a "possibility" but a reality. Within an eighteen-month period the school was completed, and later, on October 19, 1967, was officially and appropriately named the O. D. Duran Junior High School, for Mr. Duran died within a few hours after signing the necessary papers to make this school a reality.

Dedication services were held in the auditorium of the new school. Mr. Hugh Williamson, Superintendent of Education; Mr. Paul Turner, past Assistant Superintendent of Education and President of St. Clair Federal Savings & Loans Association; Dr. Austin Staples, pastor of the First Baptist Church, Pell City, were the guest speakers. Guests of honor were Mrs. O. D. Duran, Mrs. Julius (Sandra Duran) Barrett, Jr., and Jimmy Duran.

Architectural plans for the building were approved by the County Board of Education--Harold Williams, Chairman; Robert L. Dickinson, Charles Baswell, James Cobb, and Ralph Williams, members; Henry Sprott Long, architect; and James T. Mitchell, associate. The Scott Brothers Construction Company of Talladega, Alabama, was the contractor.

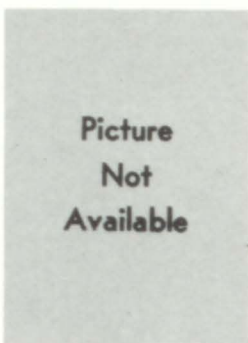

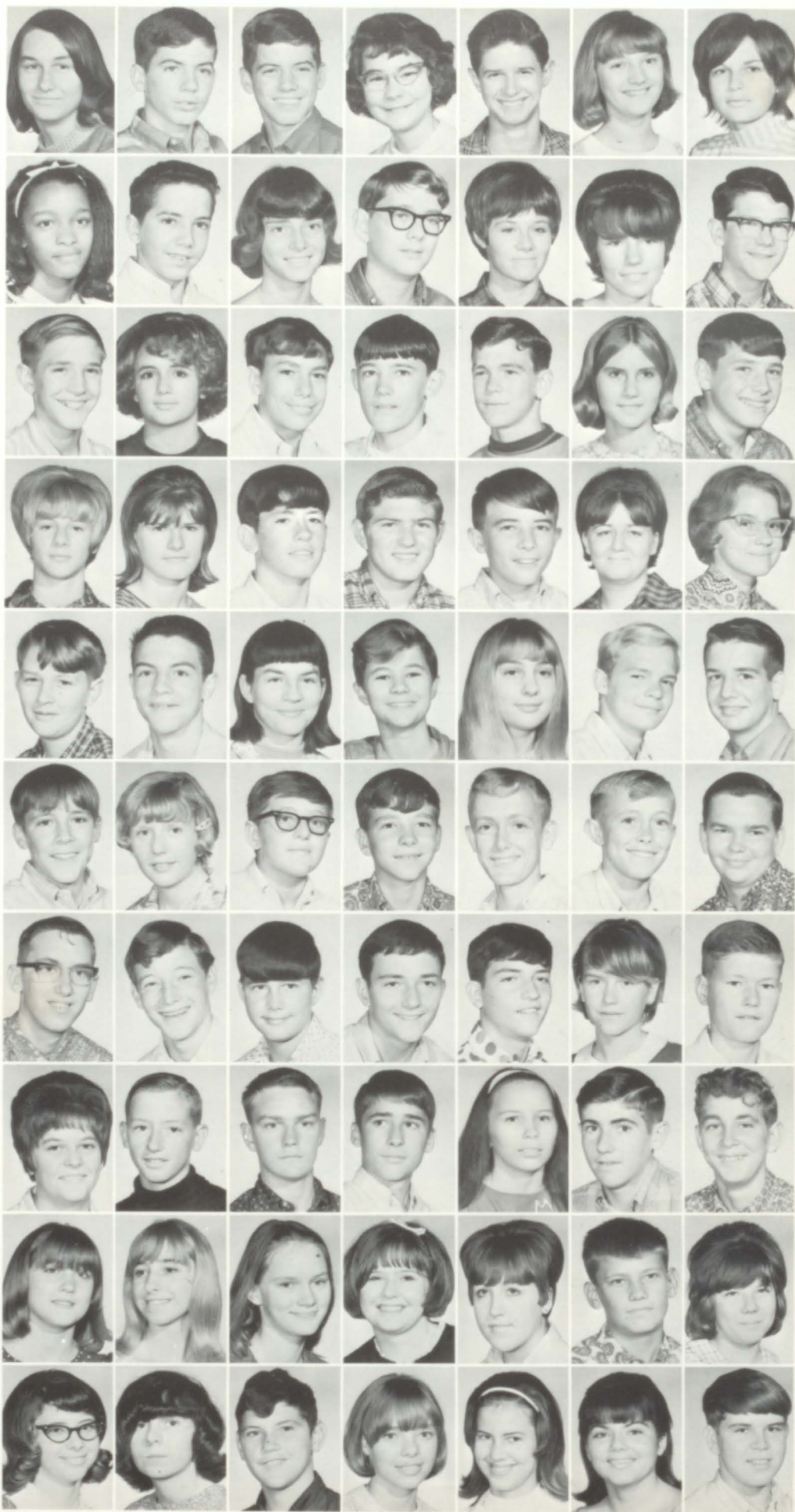

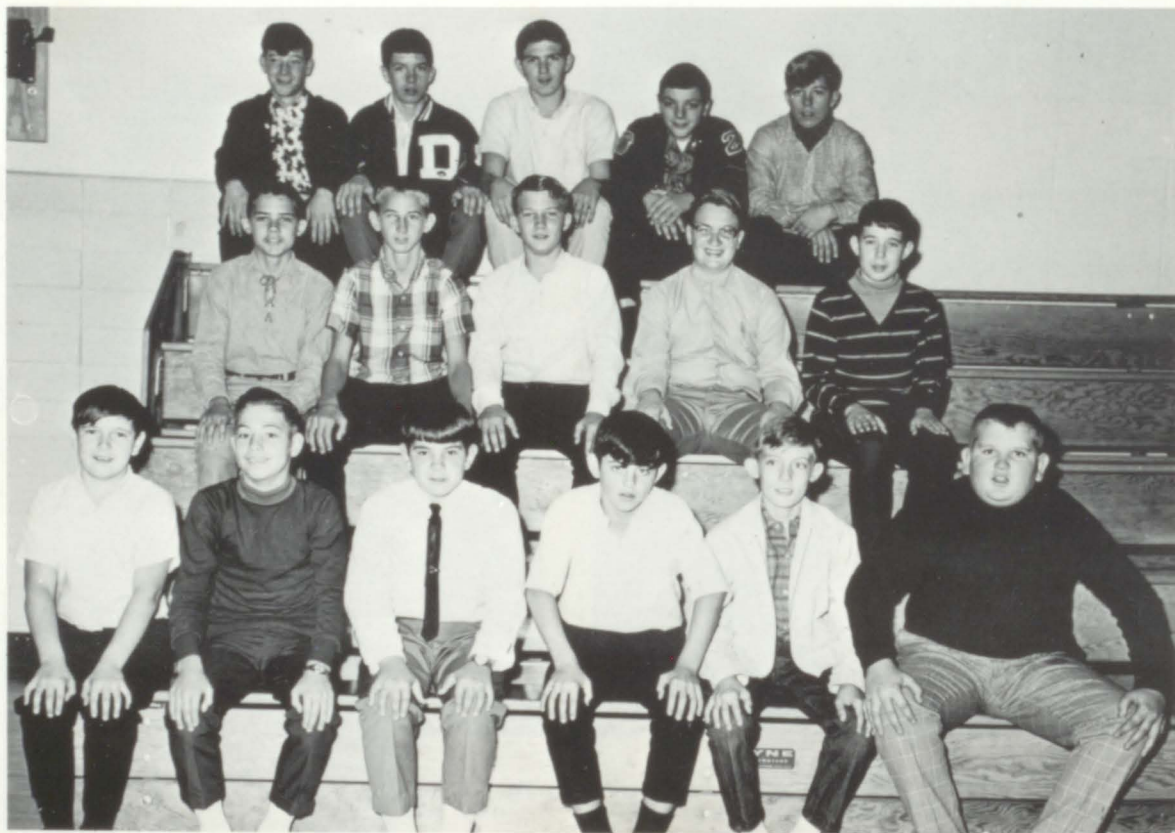
