


What happened? Lose your place Margie?

Officially Dedicated October, 1967



On June 28, 1965, the final plans for the erection of a new junior high school in Pell City were completed and approved by O. D. Duran, who was Superintendent of Education, thus seeing another of his dreams for education in St. Clair County no longer a "possibility" but a reality. Within an eighteen-month period the school was completed, and later, on October 19, 1967, was officially and appropriately named the O. D. Duran Junior High School, for Mr. Duran died within a few hours after signing the necessary papers to make this school a reality.

Dickinson, Charles Baswell, James Cobb, and Ralph Williams, members; Henry Sprott Long, architect; and James T. Mitchell, associate. The Scott Brothers Construction Company of Talladega, Alabama, was the contractor.
