 has surely come to an end.



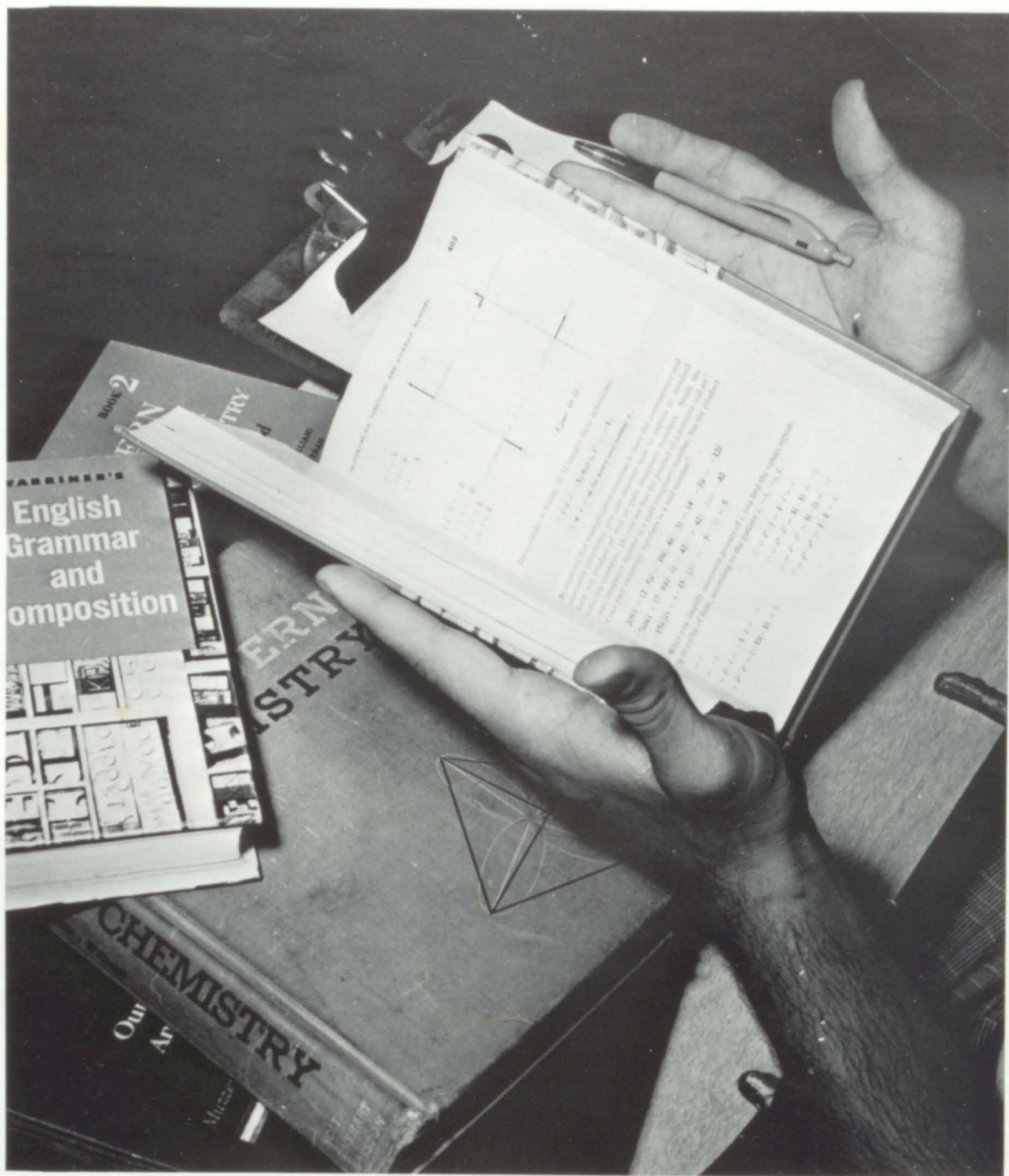

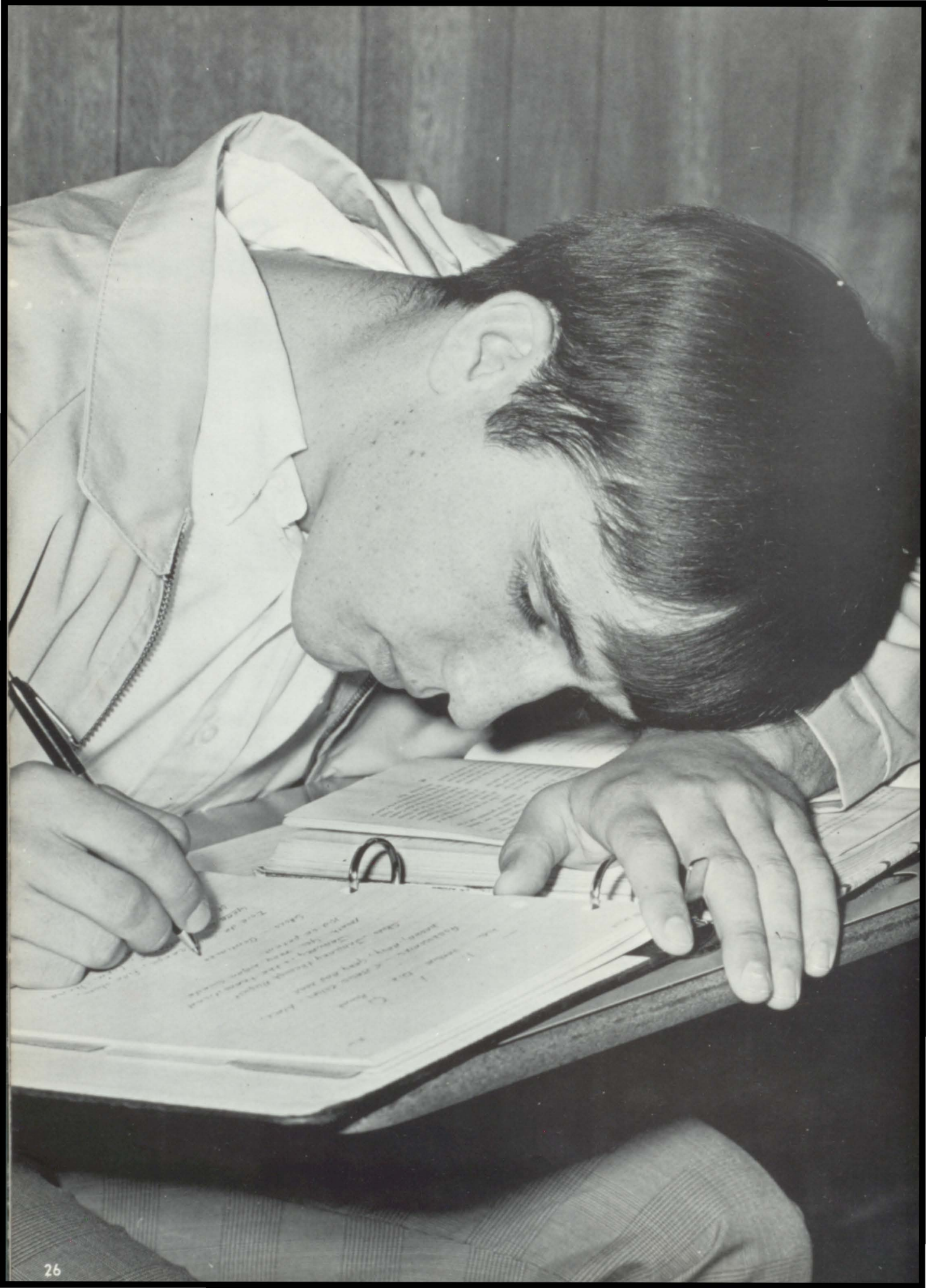




Auditorium Becomes School's New Library

It's the Friday night scene. FOOTBALL, 1968 is in the air.

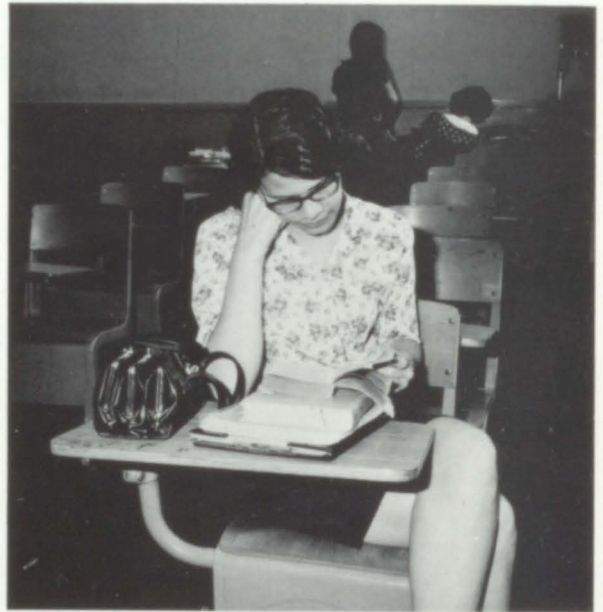

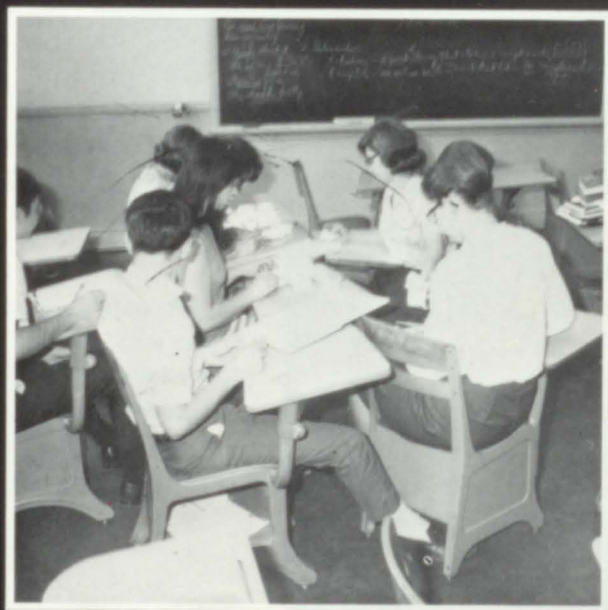
Ray Cox, captain of the 1968-1969 basketball team, was first place winner of the M. A. A. High School Math contest in our high school.

Beta Club

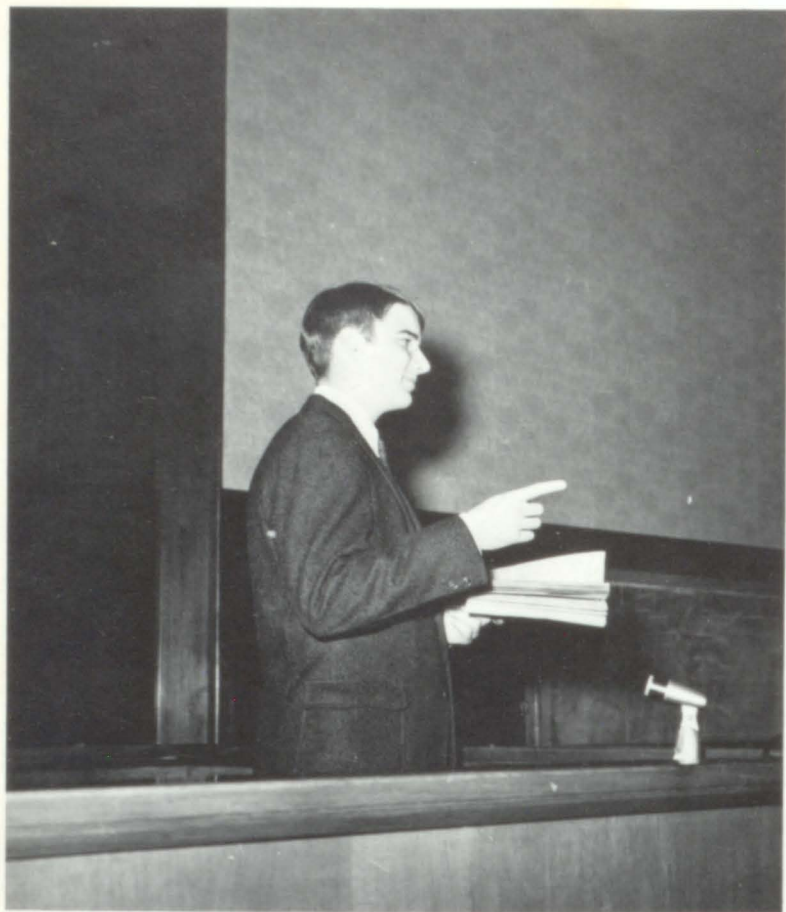

And from the life and death of Sam we learned some things that everyone should know.

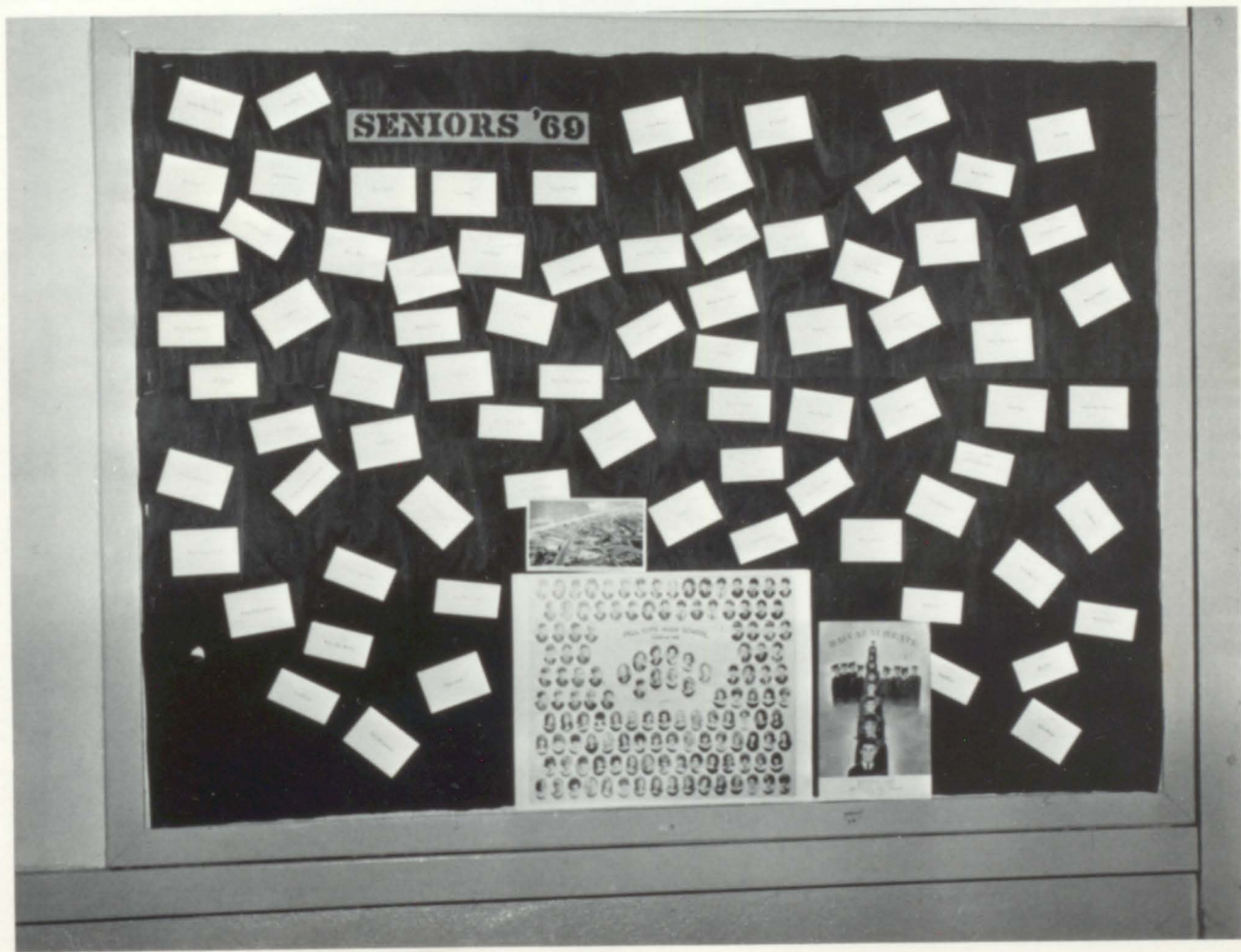
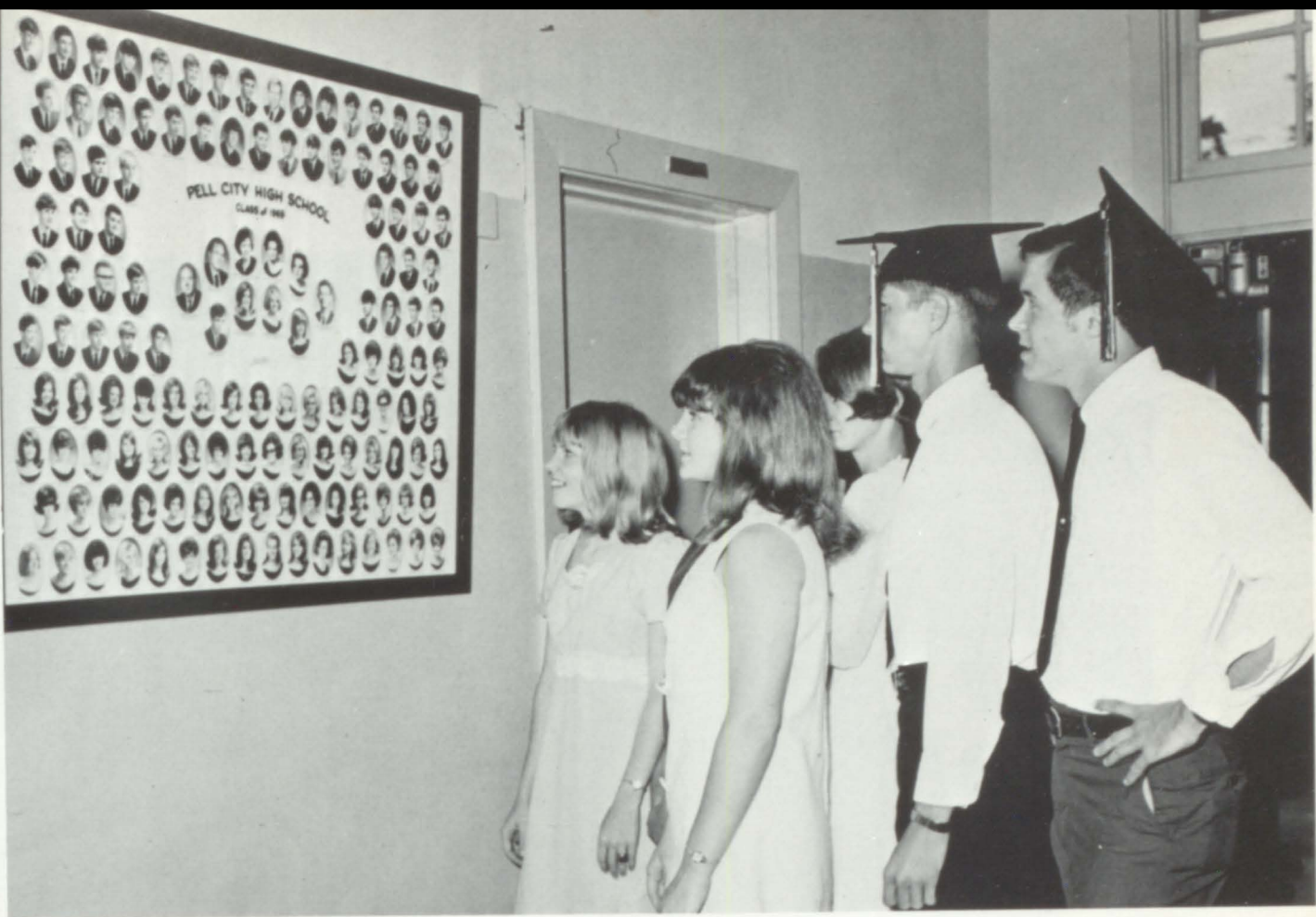

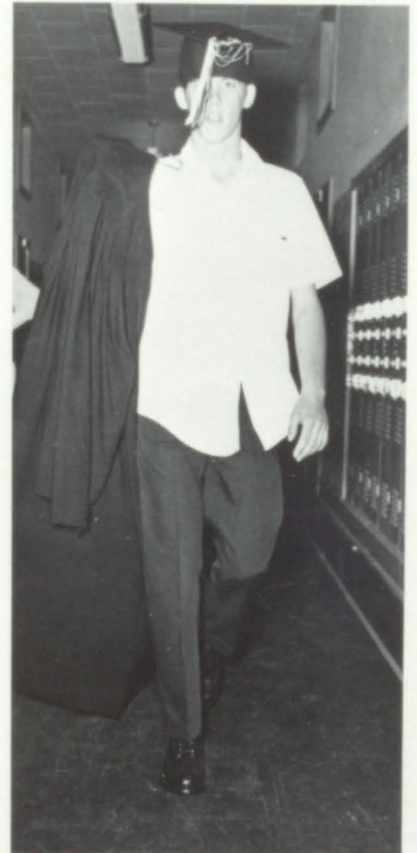

 He smiled and said, "I'm called Hello."

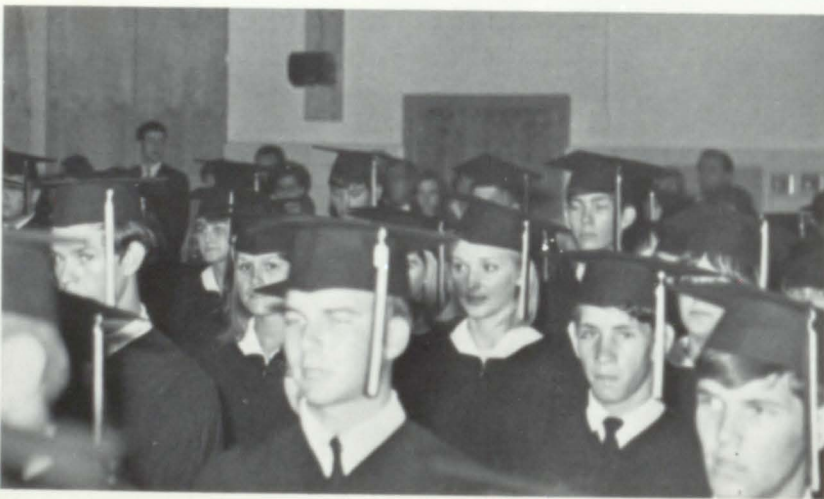
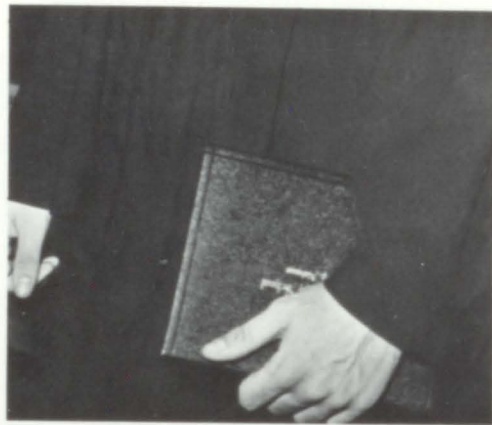
