
Conga: A Night to Remember






For the first year, several advanced courses were added to the college prep curriculum which were elective. Our Salutatorian, Mary Milam, challenged

The group then retired to their sleeping bags to watch movies. The seniors were able to leave at 6:00. It was a fun-filled night that the seniors will never forget.


















"A Looking Glass Murder"



The '87 prom was definitely a "night to remember" in more ways than one for everyone attending. Thanks, Juniors, for making it that way.








