



With each of these days opportunities are given for new beginnings.













The past is a place of security where we know our abilities and limits, but as time passes we become restless and start reaching for new goals. These goals then become the foundation for the experiences of today.













Beginnings can easily be frightening as well as exciting. The chance to start afresh makes this period in our life a memorable and rewarding time.











Many of us have grown together through good times and bad. It is times like these that cause the changes in us.


















With each of these changes we create memories and face endless new beginnings.
































FLARES








Senior Alternate: Aimee Cormier































Outstanding Football Honors Awarded




Gary Henderson






F.F.A.




Key Club






SALUTATORIAN

Academic Achievement Award Monica McGrady








Rick Sargent




Jennifer Riddle


Tim Stewart
