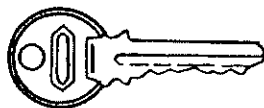

Did a little more research after your email. At the Courthouse here in Pell City the only deeds / Mortgages for the name Poby is for Robert & L Poby & his wife Mary, as well as deeds to E & L Poby. Several deeds were

between E.J. & Robert & Mary. My guess would be that E.J. is the Joseph Poby in the 1900 census with his parents Robert & Mary. Also, I assume E.J. is the one named "Joe Poby". The older residents I talked to so far only mention Joe Poby. It appears his son Joe Poby may still be alive in Augusta, Georgia per the obit for Chloe Poby Little. Also to note, the 1910-20-30 census for Robert & L. Poby stated he was a general merchant. Robert & Mary deeded their property with buildings (I assume Poby Store) to E.J. & Chloe Poby.

I hope this helps. The 1930 Death Certificate for Robert Poby may help locate a cemetery but contacting Joe Poby in Augusta may be of help.

Jan. 16, 1919, *The Progress*: FUNDERBURG-LANKFORD. Walker's Crossing: There is to be a wedding before long. Miss Ernestine Funderburg of this place to W. Roston Lankford of Springville.

Jan. 23, 1919, *The Progress*: Carrol Campbell, of Birmingham, died at home in that city, last Friday morning. Carroll was the youngest brother of Mrs. R. A. Martin, of Pell City. Dr. and Mrs. Martin and children, John and Mary Ruth, attended the funeral service.

Jan. 23, 1919, *The Progress*: Miss Mabel Doby, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. E. L. Doby, died in Atlanta Monday evening at 10 o'clock. She was at the home of her sister, Mrs. W. L. Scott. Miss Doby was well-known in this community, having spent a great deal of her time here the past 10 years.

Jan. 30, 1919, *The Progress*: Mr. H. R. Brown, now of Albany, Ga., died

last Saturday at that place, after suffering with influenza. Mr. Brown formerly lived in Pell City and his death is a great shock to this community.

Jan. 30, 1919, *The Progress*: Born on Monday morning, Jan. 27, 1919, to Mr. and Mr. H. Gaither Perry, a son.

Feb. 20, 1919; Alice Cornelia Turner, little daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Turner, died Tuesday and was buried Wednesday at Seddon.

Feb. 27, 1919, *The Progress*: Mr. J. T. Levering died Sunday night Feb. 16 at Riverside and was buried Monday at Riverside cemetery. Rev. W. P. Lovell of Pell City conducted the funeral services. Mr. Levering was the father of Mrs. C. T. Caldwell, was 71 years of age and a highly respected citizen.

Mar. 6, 1919, *The Progress*: Just as *Progress* is ready for press, we learn of the death of Mrs. Addie Roberson, wife of Jas. R. Roberson, of Cropwell, after a lingering illness of pneumonia.

Mar. 6, 1919, *The Progress*: Mrs. J. C. B. Alverson died at Coal City Sunday morning Feb. 23 at 2 o'clock. She was the mother of 17 children, none of them being gone before her to greet her on high. She leaves her husband and eight children: Rev. L. G. Alverson, of Flat Rock, Ala.; Richard L. Alverson, Mrs. L. F. Baswell, Mrs. J. C. Savage, Mr. Bill Alverson, Misses Pauline and Lydia Mae Alverson and Frank Alverson. Rev. P. L. Newton and R. B. Lavender conducting the funeral

services.

Mar. 6, 1919, *The Progress*: S. W. Davis died at Bessemer, Tuesday Feb. 25, 1919. He was a brother of J. Vernon Davis of Pell City. His remains were interred at Pope's Chapel Feb. 26.

Mar. 6, 1919, *The Progress*: Died on 2<sup>nd</sup> of Feb., C. C. Cline, of Cooks Springs, Ala., with heart failure. He was found dead in bed by his wife who heard him in his last struggles. He was an honored member of the Baptist church, a deacon. He is survived by his wife and 7 children, 4 sons and 3 daughters, one brother and one sister.

Mar. 20, 1919, *The Progress*: The funeral services for Mr. Leonard Cornell took place at Mt. Pisgah cemetery Sunday at 1:30 by the Imperial Order of Red Men. Mr. Cornell was a victim of influenza. He is survived by his wife and 3 children.

Mar. 20, 1919, *The Progress*: Mr. C. J. Levans has just returned from Temple, Ga., where he attended the death bed and funeral of his father, Mr. P. Levans. Mr. Levans died March 17. He was never known to be sick a day in his life before this illness and had never taken a dose of doctor's medicine. If he had lived till May, he would have been 87 years old. His only remedy when taken ill was, quit eating, drink water and take exercise.

Mar. 20, 1919, *The Progress*: CARLISLE-THOMAS. Mr. Jessie Carlisle was married to Mrs. Mallie Thomas last Saturday.

Sep. 18, 1919, *The Progress*: Mrs. J. L. Evans, of Ragland, died suddenly at her home in Ragland Friday morning at 5 o'clock of heart failure. On the evening before, she seemed as lively as usual and her death came as a great shock to everybody. She is the daughter of Mr. Samuel W. Sullivan, who is still living and resides near Riverside. She was 52 years old and is survived by her husband J. L. Evans, son of "Old Dr. R. P. Evans," of this county, and nine children, who are all living: Mrs. J. A. Gray, Ragland; Mrs. W. M. King, Ragland; Mr. C. L. Evans, Cartersville, Ga.; P. P. Evans, Springville; Cecil N. Evans, Alexander City; H. Herbert Evans, University Ala.; Mrs. John Barber, Rt. 1, Pell City; Miss Nell Evans, Ragland; M. John Reed Evans, Ragland.

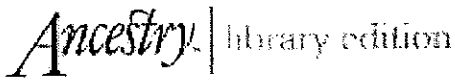

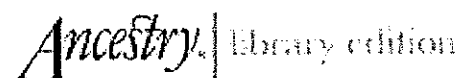

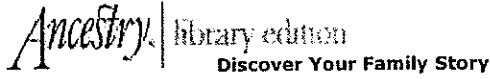

declared unconstitutional — for the establishment of a branch county seat in Pell City. He was also at one time mayor of the town. Colonel Spears was married to Florence Eugenia Mitchell, and they were the parents of three daughters: Hortense, Eugenia, and Pratt Spears.

Another unforgettable pioneer was James L. Garrett. He came with his wife, Sally Hindsman Garrett, to Pell City in 1905. He was a great politician. He was a Populist, and when that party ceased to exist, he did not return to the Democratic Party, but became a Republican. He served eighteen years (three terms) as circuit clerk of St. Clair County. Mr. Garrett was a Baptist lay leader. He loved all-day singings and singing conventions — especially the sacred harp singers. In years gone by, Mr. Garrett, James Ragland, Leroy Truitt, Austin Hazelwood, and Lester Smith sang together. Mr. Garrett's daughter, Mrs. Eula Garrett Vinson, was their accompanist.

Another of Pell City's best remembered citizens was Solomon Davis Kilgroe, who was born in 1861. He loved the land and thought every individual should own a bit of it in order to be a good citizen. At the time of his death he owned and operated nineteen small farms. His life did not lack variety, as he was an active member of the First Baptist Church, a politician, farmer, school teacher, railroad agent, bank

were B. H. Reese, H. H. Fless, H. A. Coleman, and W. D. Wilkins. Virginia Luker was clerk of commissioners court. The building was dedicated on March 3, 1956. Master of ceremonies at the dedication was Pat Roberson, and the main speaker was Governor James E. Folsom, who was introduced by Circuit Judge Frank B. Embry.

On April 23, 1956, two neighboring towns, Eden and Oak Ridge, merged with Pell City. Eden was an old municipality which flourished in the 1880's when it was the "railhead" for the track workers along the Southern Railroad. Oak Ridge was a new town, incorporated in 1947 through the efforts of E. J. Doby. This merger brought the population count to 3,644. A third area, Avondale Mills Village, also became part of the municipality in September of 1956. Until that time, the mill village had never been within the city limits of Pell City, although the mill was. The 1970 census gave the population as 5,602.
