
PCHS Class Of '48 Reunion



It was their very first day and they were happy. They met new friends and teachers who were willing to help them get a start. Some of these dropped out, until our class had only 23 to graduate.

Tonight we miss the boys who should have been here with us, but the sam needed them. Some of boys that are in service are: Jonas Luker, Jack Tucker, Leonard Glidwell, Norman Smith, Howard Smith, John Smith, Bill Brown, Wallace Brazier, Ray Bowman, and James Smith. We wish they were here with us as they use to be, but since they cannot we wish them the bast of luck in the service that they are rendering their country.
