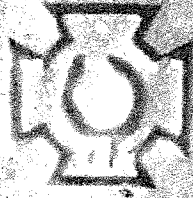

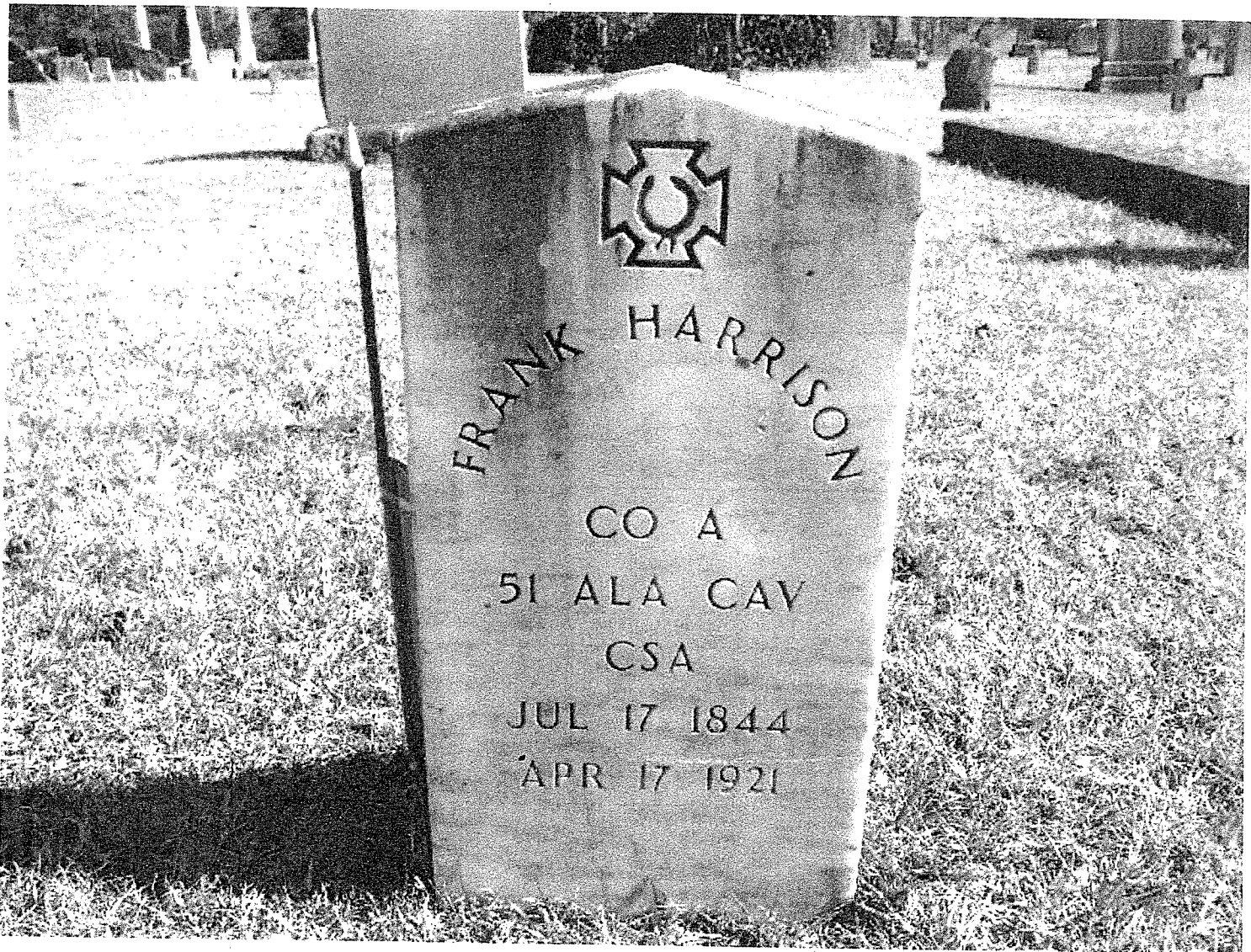

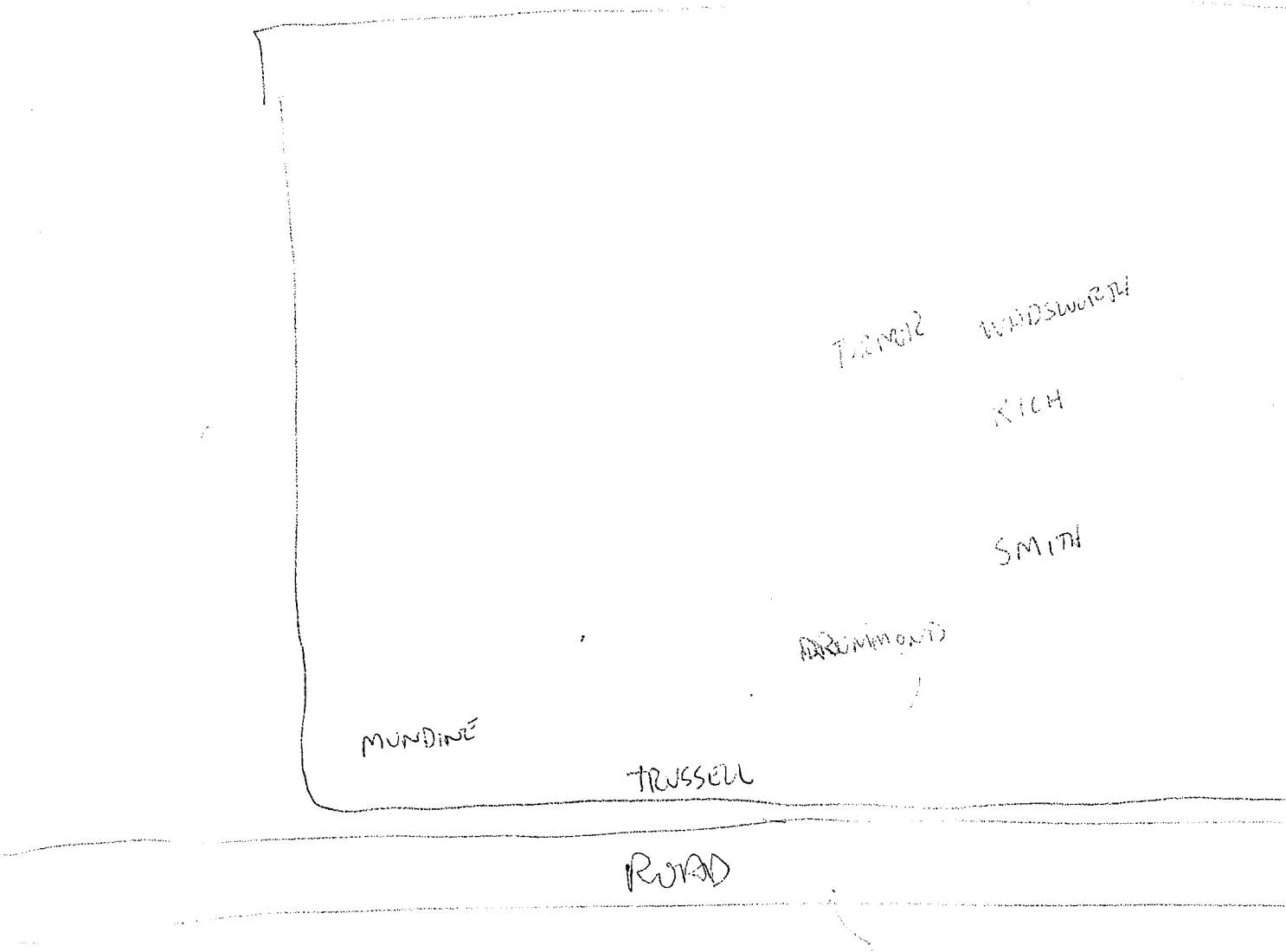

Beam, James

Jun. 10, 1926, The Southern Aegis: Mr. James beam, 89, of Ashville Rt. 2, died at his home June 5, 1926, at midnight. He is survived by his widow and two step-children, Mr. John Barkley and Mrs. Frank Boatwright, together with a host of step-grandchildren and great grandchildren. The burial was in the Cool Springs Cemetery Sunday evening at 5 o'clock.

Mr. Beam was a Soldier in the War between the States, a member of the Baptist Church for 48 years. He was confined to his bed for almost 5 months and on last Friday, knowing as he did that it was almost time for him to leave this world of worries and go to his home of glories, he called all his children and grand children and told them that he was going, and sweetest of all, said, "I am prepared to go." That being the sweetest sentence that has ever been spoken by man.

Bice, Rev. J. C.

Nov. 8, 1928, Southern Aegis: Died, Oct. 26, 1928, Rev. J. C. Bice, aged 83 years, at his home near Ashville, where he had lived for the past thirty-six years. He leaves to mourn his departure 3 sons, and 4 daughters. N. S. Bice, N. A. Bice, J. W. Bice, Miss Mary Bice, Mrs. M. N. Williams, Mrs. T. J. Williams, Mrs. Missouri Davis. His place in his community will be hard to fill. He was a loving father and a true friend. He lived the Gospel at home that he began to preach in 1876. He was an old Confederate soldier. He was buried at Friendship Cemetery by Masons. Funeral sermon by Rev. C. J. Donahoo.

Cason, Dr. Davis E.

May 15, 1924, Southern Aegis, Dr. Davis E. Cason, aged 89 years, died Sunday afternoon at the residence of his sister-in-law, Mrs. E. P. Cox. Dr. Cason practiced medicine in Ashville a number of years and for a time operated a drug store at Odenville and practiced there. He sustained a fall several years ago, which dislocated his hip. He was never able to engage in his business afterward. He was a Confederate veteran, a member of the Presbyterian Church, and a Mason. Funeral services were held Monday afternoon by Rev. W. L. Morris from the Baptist Church, after which the Masons took

charge. He leaves one son, Dr. Eugene Cason, of Talladega, and one daughter, Mrs. P. B. McCall, of California.

Cather, George R.

Feb 12, 1913, Southern Aegis: George R. Cather was born in the city of Baltimore, Md., Nov. 10th, 1836, and passed this life at his home in Ashville, Feb 9, 1913. He attended Washington College, Chestertown, Kent Co., Md., after which admitted to the Baltimore bar in the practice of his profession; that of law. Enlisted in Company D of the 1st Maryland Cavalry Battalion in the Confederate Army on the 20th day of September 1862, at Winchester, Va., and captured near Washington, D. C., July 10, 1864, honorably discharged at Elmira, New York, June 14, 1865, after Lee's surrender.

He was married to Miss Harriet H. Heath at the home of her uncle, Dr. Spotswood G. Perrow, on 18th day of September, 1867, by the Rev. B. M. Wailes, Presbyterian minister. Deceased was a member of the M. E. church, and a willing and untiring worker in the Master's Cause. His was a generous hand, giving cheerfully and asking no remuneration for any aid in his power to bestow on those who had need of it.

He established the Southern Aegis at Ashville, Ala., in January, 1873 and stood at its helm steering his ship, like a valiant captain in the course of honor and morality, with his eyes ever fixed on the stars. He began the regular prediction of the weather for his paper in the year 1876. Also for a year he forecast the weather for Home and Farm. Literature and science were his special pleasure, and in 1884 he published the Scientific Educator at Ashville, which won wide recognition in the scientific world. In 1892 this little journal became known as the Weather, which was very successful considering the little interest taken in scientific matters. His writings --- many of which have been published and quoted --- testify to his high ideals and love of humanity, as he ever worked for its uplift and development.

His body was born to its last resting place on earth by six young men as pall bearers, followed by a number of his old army comrades, and by a large caravan of neighbors and mourning friends. The funeral services were conducted by his pastor the Rev. W. L. Holdridge, while Col. Jno. W. Inzer, valiant citizen and patriot, paid a beautiful tribute to his dead friend's memory, among other things said he had been faithful to every trust confided to him. His tribute to the deceased as a Confederate soldier and his remarks to his old comrades were very touching when speaking of the ties that bound these old soldiers.

His beloved wife preceded him to that Eternity a few weeks ago, and six of eight children are left to testify to their father's worth: W. H. Cather, of Centre; B. B. Cather, of Ashville; Bays D. Cather, of Pell City; A. H. Cather, of Birmingham; and Marcia Ney and A. L. Cather, of Ashville all left to miss one who had been both father and comrade to them, who will ever cherish his memory and feel his dear spirit near them.

Cox, Oliver

April 24, 1873, Southern Aegis: Died, on the 21st inst., at his residence, three miles from Ashville, on Beaver Creek, Oliver Cox, in his 36 year. He was a member of the 10th Alabama Regiment in the late war—loved by his old comrades in arms—honest, upright and brave, he went through the entire war. He was a member of the Baptist Church, joined since the war, during his illness expressed a willingness to die, but was calm, resigned and submissive to his Maker's will, and strong in faith, he died, praising, and calling upon his friends to praise God. He leaves a wife and two children.

Crandall, Maj. Edwin Alphonso

Sept 30, 1897, The Southern Aegis: Died on Sept 22, 1897, at the Davis Infirmary, Birmingham, Ala., Maj. Edwin Alphonso Crandall, of Springville, aged 78.

The deceased was born at Springfield, N. Y., Oct 20 1818. In 1836 he came south where he engaged in civil engineering and for several years was president of the Division of the Central of Ga. And also president of what was then known as the Mississippi Valley Railway, now Memphis and Charleston, and aided in the construction of some of the earliest railroads in Georgia, Tennessee and Mississippi.

In 1861, he received from the authorities of Tennessee the appointment of colonel of the ordnance department and served under the Confederate government in the same position with enlarged duties until the close of the war.

After the war he returned to those avocations to which his mind always seemed inclined and for 20 years was connected with the land department of the Ala. Gt. Southern, which position he held at the time of his death.

He married Henrietta Welmer, Memphis, Tenn., Sept 1860, who died Apr. 23, 1868, leaving no issue. He married again Oct. 7, 1869, Anna W. Walker, of Calhoun Co., Ala., who was born in Talladega County March 1, 1844, and died at her home in Springville in 1895. By the last marriage there were 9 children, 5 of whom are living, 3 of them sons, and 2 daughters.

For three months before death came as a relief, the deceased was a great sufferer. His body was embalmed and brought to Springville to his home and children where it was interred after appropriate services at the M. E. Church south, of which he has been a member for many years.

Thus has passed away another of the county's best citizens and men of worth; a man of great liberality. He will be missed in his community by his church which he loved and worked so faithfully.

Crow, Abner

Mar 8, 1923, Southern Aegis: Abner Crow, age 77, one of St. Clair County's well known citizens, died Feb 27, 1823, at the residence of his son-in-law, Dr. W. B. Johnson, in

Birmingham, where he had gone for a visit, accompanied by his devoted daughter Miss Jeanette. Mr. Crow had been in declining health for more than a year.

He was born Feb. 19, 1846, a son of Roland B. and Elizabeth Lankford Crow, pioneers, whose father, Abner Crow was one of the originators of the Crow Iron Works near Anniston where the first iron was manufactured in Alabama before the war between the states. He was a Veteran serving gallantly in Company E. Wheeler's Cavalry, 51st Ala. Regiment. Was captured and imprisoned in Camp Chase, Ohio, until his discharge, in June 1865.

It was in this prison that he surrendered his heart to Christ Jesus, identified himself with the Ashville Baptist Church and was baptized in 1905.

Mr. Crow was married Feb. -, 1873, one day after he was 27 years of age, to lovely Ellen Hodges, daughter of Josiah Hodges, she having preceded him to the grave May 23, 1907. Born to them were 4 sons and 5 daughters. An infant son, Sheriff Walter Crow, and Miss Agnes, the oldest daughter, having also preceded him to the Beyond.

He is survived by the following children: Mrs. James North, Mrs. T. A. Neely, Mrs. W. B. Johnson, John T. Crow, Abner Crow, Jr., and Miss Jeanette Crow.

Seven grand children: Mrs. Geo. Hodges, John Pelham North, Miss Margaret North, Bill, Abner, Virginia and Edward Johnson, one great grand daughter, Nell Burnett Hodges.

Two sisters also survive, Mrs. John S. E. Robinson and Mrs. M. A. Dobbins.

Funeral services were held March 2, 1923, at the Ashville Baptist Church, interment in Ashville Cemetery with Dr. W. B. Holmes assisted by the Lodge 186 A. F. & A. M. of which Mr. Crow had been an ardent member for 51 years. Nephews and nieces noticed in attendance at the funeral were Dr. F. E. Crow, John Braden, Mrs. Annie Dobbins, Jas. P. Dobbins, Atty. Chas. R. Robinson, Mrs. J. Manly Inzer, Mrs. Geo. A. Ash, Mrs. R. R. Hodges, Dr. Aldrich Crow, John R. Robinson.

Early, Rev John Edmond

Feb. 18, 1914, Southern Aegis: John Edmond Early was born January 18 1836, and died February 14, 1914. He leaves a wife and several children to mourn his death. He has been afflicted for a number of years. His last illness was for 5 or 6 weeks duration.

His life was a success. This fact was partly evidenced by the large attendance at his funeral on Sunday at Reeves Grove cemetery, but more beautifully pictured when we think of his faith in God. He was patient to many were the expressions of peace and joy to the very last. He said, "I am just waiting for the Lord to call me; I am ready to go."

Brother Early joined the Methodist church when quite a young boy, and he lived a consistent member until death.

He was a soldier in the Civil War, and will ever be remembered as one who was brave and fearless. The writer can imagine that when the future historian shall chronicle the noble deeds and heroes who toiled and suffered to plant freedom in our land and to plant a plain gospel in our country in all its purity, the name of Uncle Edmond Early will be recalled. He has fallen as a brave warrior upon the field of battle. May the blessings of God ever rest upon the family left behind.

Funeral services were conducted by his pastor, assisted by Rev. N. A. Hood and several short and impressive talks made by citizens.

Ford, J. W.

Aug. 8, 1929, Southern Aegis: J. W. Ford, 84, one of the pioneer citizens of St. Clair Co., died at this home in the Hopewell community at 7:30 o'clock Monday morning, the victim of old age.

The funeral was held at Hopewell church Tuesday 11:00 a.m., services conducted by Rev. Rice.

Mr. Ford was a Confederate soldier and was regarded as one of the finest in the service of the South. His passing has caused universal sorrow.

Gaskie, Andrew J.

July 6, 1910, Southern Aegis: Probably the oldest inhabitant of St. Clair County, Mr. Gaskie, died at his home near Ashville on Saturday, Jun 18. He was over 100 years old and was believed to be 110. He fought in the Mexican and Indian Wars and [the war] between the states.

Hare, Rev. S. J.

Jun. 10, 1932, The Southern Aegis: D. J. Hare, age 85, passed away at his home in Leeds the latter part of last week. Mr. Hare was a veteran of the war between the states and had resided in St. Clair County for more than half a century before moving to Leeds. Surviving are his widow, three sons and one sister. Interment at Ashville.

Higginbotham, J. M.

Dec. 21, 1911, The Progress: Mr. J. M. Higginbotham died at his home on last Friday, Dec. 15. He leaves a wife and three grown children to mourn his death. Mr. Higginbotham has lived in St. Clair County, between Coal City and Ragland, for the past 40 years, is well known and liked through tout the county. He moved to Alabama during the conclusion of the Civil War. Mrs. W. H. Springer is a daughter of his. The sad family wishes to thank their friends for the kindness they have shown them. [Mr. Higginbotham is listed in the St. Clair County, Alabama 1907 Confederate Census.]

Hodges, William Terry

Apr. 24, 1919, Southern Aegis: William Terry Hodges, aged 75, died at a local infirmary in Birmingham, at 11:30 o'clock Monday morning. Funeral services were held at Ashville Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock, Rev. N. A. Hood led the services and Judge

Jno. W. Inzer and Rev. J. S. E. Robertson made affecting talks and spoke of the deceased as they knew him.

Mr. Hodges was a confederate veteran and a deacon of the first Baptist Church. He was born in St. Clair County and associated with the most prosperous business establishments of out town and county, and was very prominent and popular with his associates. It has been the editor's good fortune to have known him long and well, and to know him was to esteem him more highly as the years passed by. Today we miss his kindly smile and jovial greeting.

He is survived by a widow, Mrs. Libby Hodges; one daughter, Mrs. Sam Simpson; and D. H. Hodges, of Odenville, two brothers, Jas. A. Hodges, Ashville and T. J. Hodges, Birmingham.

Hood, Rev. N. A.

May 3, 1922, Pell City News: Rev. N. A. Hood one of the oldest and most respected citizens of St. Clair County died at the home of his son Oscar, near Ashville, early Sunday morning. Rev. Hood was born and raised in this county; he was 78 years old and had been a preacher of the Baptist Church for more than 40 years. At a very young age he volunteered in the service of his country and was wounded in the Civil War. Bro. Hood always took the stand for whatever he thought was right.

He is survived by the following children: Oscar Hood, of Ashville; Hon. O. A. Hood, of Gadsden; Will Hood, of Washington City; Inzer Hood, John Hood and Solon Hood of Birmingham. Two daughters, Mrs. Nannie Morris of Birmingham and Mrs. Callie Hunt. All of his children were with him when the end came, except Will. Mr. Jeff Hood of Ashville is the only surviving brother of the deceased.

The funeral was held at the Baptist Church Sunday afternoon by Bro. Palmer of near Ashville. Bro. Hood was buried by the masons of which he had been a member for many years.

There were many out of town friends present to pay their last respects to the deceased.

Ingram, Maj. J. B.

Feb 15, 1912, St. Clair Co. News, Ragland: Maj. Ingram. One of St. Clair's Leading Citizens Passes to the Great Beyond. Maj. J. B. Ingram died at his home several miles south of town of Sunday morning last, from cancer. Maj. Ingram was one of this section of the state's leading men, having lived in Alabama most of his life, coming to the state from Georgia when but a lad, locating in Calhoun county where he grew to manhood and fifty-seven years ago married Miss Sarah Dulaney. He then moved to St. Clair County locating at the old Ingram homestead, where he lived thirty years. Was one of the old

Confederate soldiers, we all hold so dear, was 78 years of age; a member of the Baptist church, joining quite young. The funeral services were held Monday afternoon at the Baptist church, conducted by Rev. Wm. McCain, who spoke of Maj. Ingram's loyalty to his God and man. Interment was made in the Box cemetery.

Inzer, Lt. Col. John Washington

Jan. 12, 1928, Southern Aegis: LAST MEMBER OF THE SECESSION CONVENTION John W. Inzer, of St. Clair County, who died at the great age of 94 years, was the last of that daring band of Alabamians who sat in the secession convention at Montgomery and voted to withdraw this state from the Union.

Judge Inzer did not favor secession as the proper means of impressing the north with the grievances of the slave-holding south, though on the final vote on the ordinance of secession, he like many others that doubted the wisdom of withdrawal, cast his lot with the Yancy bloc.

He went into the Confederate army and attained distinction as a soldier, first as captain, and finally as regimental commander. Returning home after the war, Judge Inzer continued to place his fellow citizens in his debt by his intelligent and patriotic conduct. After the war, he was lawyer, legislator, and circuit judge, and again a soldier. He loved the military life and lent his talents to the building up of the national guard in the state, serving for a long period as a brigadier-general.

Judge Inzer was an honored figure in the state, better remembered by the older generation than the new, but much esteemed by all who knew him. He was the youngest member of the secession convention, entering that short-lived body at 26. With this advantage plus the advantage of a sound body, he survived all of his colleagues by many years, dying nearly 70 years after participating in a classic episode in the history of his country.

McLaughlin, Dr. James Madison

Dr. J. M. McLaughlin, who died at Springville, Alabama, on October 23, 1908, was born at Leeds, Jefferson County, Ala., in March 1838. He was the son of John McLaughlin, one of the first settlers of Tennessee, who removed later to Alabama, and whose father, Alexander Andrew McLaughlin, emigrated from Scotland to Tennessee.

James McLaughlin read medicine with Drs. Robertson and Freeman at Springville, and then attended the Atlanta Medical College for two years. From that place he enlisted in the Confederate Army as a member of Company C., 18th Alabama Regiment, and was soon made captain of the company. In 1864 he was appointed Lieutenant Colonel, as which he continued to the close of the war. He had declined the appointment as assistant surgeon of his regiment.

Dr. McLaughlin was married in 1877 to Miss Isadora Forman, and their one child is Mrs. Katherine Burt Forney, widow of the late Prof. Jacob Forney, of the Alabama State

University. Comrade McLaughlin was a loving father, a good citizen, a brave soldier, and a Christian gentleman.

Nunnelly, Anderson Greene

On April 27, 1903, at his home in Springville, Alabama, Anderson Greene Nunnelly died. - age about 74 years.

The deceased was born at Greenville, South Carolina, in 1829, and at the age of six years moved with his father and family to Calhoun County in 1835. From that county he later moved to St. Clair, where he has resided for a number of years. He joined the Baptist Church when quite young and throughout his years had exemplified the life of a Christian. He reared a large family all of whom are members of the church and doing well. No man ever exhibited stronger faith in his religious profession, none ever stood more steadfast to what he believed to be right, and we think we speak the truth when we say, none ever experienced richer rewards of joy among brethren of all branches of the Christian church in the exercises of religious worship than he did.

He has departed leaving behind him to his children and all who knew him a royal example of a Christian life. His funeral took place at Ashville on April 28 and was attended by a large number of our citizens. At the funeral service Rev. P. S. Pearson, James M.

June 12, 1902, Springville item: Died at his home near Springville, Ala. On June 7th, 1902 James M. Pearson, aged 64 years. Mr. Pearson was one of our oldest and most respected citizens. He served four years in the war between the states, and was one among the truest and bravest of soldiers. He was an honest and upright Christian gentleman. At home he was a good husband, and kind father. He had been afflicted for years, but had borne it with much patience. He was born in this community and had lived here all his life. His remains were interred in the cemetery here last Sunday. The funeral services being conducted by Rev. J. C. McClung and others. The deceased leaves behind him a wife, three sons and two daughters, with many friends and relatives to mourn their loss. The bereaved family have the sincere sympathies of our entire community.

Robinson, Rev. J. S. E.

Dec. 25, 1924, Southern Aegis: Funeral services for Rev. J. S. E. Robinson were held at the Baptist Church here last Monday at 2:30 p. m., being conducted by Rev. T. C. Wyatt of Birmingham.

Rev. Robinson, who has been in ill health for some months, died at his residence two miles west of here on December 21st at the age of eighty years. He was born in the Greenville District, South Carolina, but came with his parents to Trussville, Alabama, in 1849. In a few years they moved to the old Robinson Homestead where the deceased resided continuously till the time of his death. He was a Confederate Veteran and had been an active Baptist minister for fifty years, having been pastor of one church for forty-seven years.

The deceased was married in 1867 to Miss Adora Virginia Crowe, who, together with one brother, Tom Robinson, one son Charles R. Robinson, first assistant U. S. Attorney of Birmingham, three daughters, Mrs. George A. Ash, Mrs. J. Manly Inzer, and Mrs. R. R. Hodges, eleven grand-children and six great-grand children, survive him.

The Pall Bearers were John F. Braden, Abner Crowe, Joe E. Robinson, Harold B. Robinson and J. W. Inzer, nephews and grandsons of the deceased. The Honorary Pall Bearers were from the Masonic Fraternity of which he had been a faithful member since 1866.

The funeral was held last Monday at 2:30 o'clock at the Ashville Baptist Church and the burial followed at the Ashville Cemetery.

Mr. Robinson had been a Baptist Preacher for more than half a century and had preached in every Baptist Church of St. Clair County and in scores of adjoining counties. He was a very devout man and devoted much of his time and energy toward promoting the Baptist Church and the Christian religion. He was a successful farmer and business man. At one time he represented St. Clair and Etowah Counties in the State Senate. He was a man of strong character and was greatly loved by the people of St. Clair County.

His family has been prominent in all of its affairs for many years and news of his death is sure to cause wide-spread regret.

Smith, D. J.

Mar 9, 1911, The Progress: D. J. Smith died at this home in Seddon on the 22nd day of Feb. He was 81 years old, leaves a wife and 8 children to survive him. J. A. Smith of Seddon; W. B. Smith of Beaumont, Miss.; H.T. Smith of Moxi, Miss.; C. E. Smith of Sanford, Ala.; Mrs. Ella Adams of Earle, Miss.; Mrs. Ida Stone of Hollins, Miss.; and Mrs. Sallie Stone of College Park, Ga.; 37 grand children and 4 great grandchildren. He was one of the first to volunteer in his county to go to the war in 1860. He was born in South Carolina. His parents moved south when he was quite a boy. He has spent almost all of his life a farmer. In the large family of 8 children, himself and wife, his was the first death in the family. Mr. Smith numbered his friends by the thousands.

Stewart, J. H.

Mar. 15, 1928, Southern Aegis: Died at the home of his daughter in Odenville, Ala., Friday, March 9, 1928, J. H. Stewart, 81. He had been in declining health for several years. He was a Confederate veteran, and a faithful member of the Masonic graternity, a member of the Baptist Church. He reared a family of 11 children. Turley, John

Aug. 16 1911, Southern Aegis: John Turley, a Confederate soldier and one of the oldest citizens of St. Clair County, died August 12th, 1911, at his home near Steele. He was 90 years old and served in the Civil War under Generals Lee and Jackson. The funeral took place at Deerman's Chapel, August 13.

Vandegrift, John Leonard

October 22, 1908, St. Clair County News: Just at the close of day on Oct. 5th, 1908, John Leonard Vandegrift, one of St. Clair's most prominent citizens passed away at his home at Branchville, Ala., following a lingering illness, the beginning of which dated back twelve months, he having had a stroke of paralysis a year ago, from the effects he never recovered.

John Leonard Vandegrift was born in St. Clair County, Ala., Oct. 25th, 1836, and lived and died within a few miles of his birthplace. He was a Confederate soldier, having fought bravely through four long years of the Civil war. He was also a faithful and honored member of the Presbyterian church from boyhood. He was a prominent member of the Odd Fellows with whose impressive service he was laid to rest at Liberty, Wednesday morning Oct., 7th, 1908.

On Oct. 29, 1865, Mr. Vandegrift was married to Mary L Braden, who survives him. To them was born ten children, nine of whom survive him; Mrs. L. S. Stovall, Mrs. P. A. Glenn, Miss Alma Vandegrift, Finis and Delphus Vandegrift, all of Branchville, Ala. Mrs. A. W. Veasey and J. B. Vandegrift of Nashville Tenn. He is survived by two sisters and one brother, Mrs. Judge Box of Birmingham, Ala., Mrs. Sara Byram of Cullman, Ala., and A. S. Vandegrift of Los Angeles, Cal.

Mr. Vandegrift will be missed. He was a man of unswerving loyalty to his family, his friends and his convictions. His private life was pure, and his public life was open and honest. He was a man of noble impulses.

Williams, Capt. J. C.

Oct. 30, 1919, Southern Aegis: Died at 6 o'clock p.m. Oct. 23, 1919, Capt. J. C. Williams, one mile east of Ashville, Age 83 years. In the passing of Capt. J. C. Williams, St. Clair County and Ashville especially, has lost one of her most highly respected citizens. He was a Confederate veteran, having served with distinction in Co. E, 51st Alabama Cavalry [with] Col. John T. Morgan.

Until just a few months before his death Capt. Williams was seemingly quite well and remarkably well-preserved for a man of his age, showing his training in the cavalry by his erect and distinguished bearing on horseback. He entered the Confederate service at the age of 25 years as 2nd Sergeant, the Co. being at first known as the Ala. Partisan Rangers. He was wounded in 1864 at Augusta, Ga., having been promoted to a Captaincy and filling every trust imposed upon him with fidelity and efficiency.

Capt. Williams was born of S.C. parents in Cherokee County, Ala., coming to St. Clair County in his early manhood. He was a staunch member of the Baptist Church and a Mason. He leaves a wife, five sons and a host of relatives and friends to mourn his death. Interment at Hopewell Cemetery Saturday the 25th, the Masons in charge.

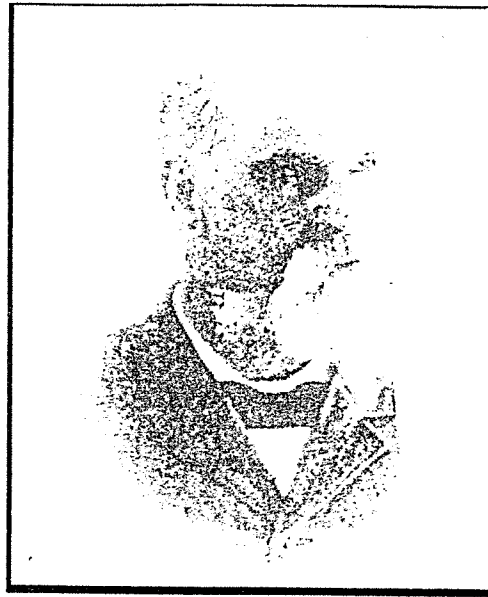

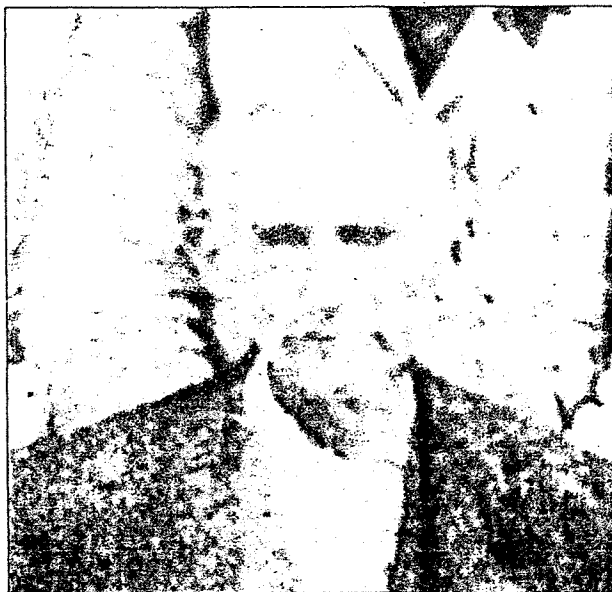
