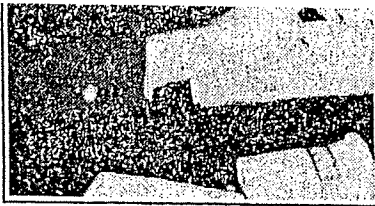

Last Rites Held For O. L. Ekwurzel Monday

Last rites were held Monday afternoon for Otto Lyon Ekwurzel, age 63. Mr. Ekwurzel died at the residence here Sunday afternoon. He had been in ill health for several months. Funeral services were held at the home with interment at Valley Hill Cemetery. Ben M. Jacobs Masonic Lodge No. 643, conferred full Masonic funeral rites, Rev. H. M. Hudson officiating, Kilgroe directing.

The deceased man came to Pell City nearly 32 years ago, worked as local agent and a telegraph operator for the Southern Railway here. Until his retirement nearly two years ago he had been in the employ of the railroad company for more than 40 years. He was a member of the Methodist church, the Masons, and until a few months ago had taken an active part in the civic and political life of Pell City.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Ella H. Ekwurzel, one son, Otto L. Ekwurzel, Jr., Jacksonville, Fla., three daughters, Mrs. Ed Vaughn, Talladega, Mrs. L. S. Day, Birmingham, and Mrs. Joe Amshey, Washington, D. C.

The slaying occurred at the home of the couple about 10 miles southwest of Eden on the Wolf Creek road last Wednesday night. Mrs. Carden told arresting officer R. F. Alverson and Coroner Jack deGaris, that her husband came home the afternoon before the killing occurred under the influence of whiskey, that she had objected to him trading some of their home grown hams for a quantity of beer and that he became abusive, threatened her with a chair and told her that he would "kill her before morning." She told the officers that after her husband went to bed she took a 12 gauge shotgun from the gun rack, shot her husband as he lay on the bed and returned the gun to the rack.

Coroner deGaris rendered a verdict of 1st degree murder and Chief Deputy Alverson arrested Mrs. Carden. She was later released after furnishing a \$2,500 bond.

Funeral services were held for the slain man at the Plum Springs Cemetery near Eastaboga. He is survived by the widow, five daughters and three brothers.
