# Methodists, United Brethren

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 13 — The governing bodies of the Methodist and the Evangelical United Brethren Churches voted to take steps to push ahead "a little further down the long road to Christian unity."

The Methodist Church with 10.3 million members spread over the world in 38,876 local churches, voted overwhelmingly for union with the EUB Church, which has 750,000 communicants in 4,287 congregations.

THE NEW denomination, if and when it is fully consummated in 1968, will be known

as the United Methodist Church.

The action of the two general conferences, meeting simultaneously this week at the Conrad Hilton Hotel, does not bring about immediate union.

The proposal, called the plan of union of the Methodist and the Evangelical United Brethren Churches, must be submitted to the 93 Methodist and 32 EUB annual conferences for ratification.

The Methodists must ratify the plan by at least a two-thirds vote of all delegates present and voting in the annual conferences, the 32 EUB conferences by at least a

three-fourths vote of their delegates present and voting.

EUB CONFERENCES begin voting in February and end in July. The Methodist annual conferences will vote between May 1 and July 1. The final decision on union should be apparent by July, 1967.

If the final decision is approval, the union would be consummated when the two denominations meet in April, 1968, in Dallas, Tex.

Through this union, the Methodist Church under its new name would pass in membership the 10.6-million Southern Baptist Convention.

The Methodist vote for union with the EUB after noon Friday was 749-40 with five abstentions. The EUB vote was 325-88 with one abstention.

THE VOTE BY the EUB, taken after the Methodist vote, had been expected to be a crucial one. The reason for this was that many of the EUB delegates had expressed fears that their smaller denomination would be swallowed up by the much larger Methodist communion.

The vote for union came after a joint committee reached an agreement during a few tense hours of doubt among some that union could or would be approved.

Major differences on which there were disagreements were "policy lines" the Methodist legislative body had

taken. These include election of bishops and election by conferences of district superintendents and acceptance of a target date of 1972 for elimination through voluntary steps of racially segregated regional conferences rather than through a mandatory deadline.

The EUB delegates sought a four-year term for bishops rather than follow the Methodist life-tenure system.

METHODIST delegates adhere strictly to life tenure for bishops, to which the EUB group finally agreed. The EUB also accepted the appointment of district superintendents by bishops after the Methodists agreed to eliminate from the proposed constitution of the union the phrase "appointed by the bishop." Many Methodists were surprised to learn that, in the present constitution of their denomination, these words do not appear with reference to district superintendents.

Certain liberal groups demanded racial integration before uniting.

The proposal to place in the Constitution of the new church a target date of 1972 for segregation on the basis of race, color, national origin and economic condition was offered by Dr. Arthur Fleming, former secretary of the U.S. Health, Education and Welfare Department and now president of Oregon University.

# vote for unity

This was incorporated in the plan of union constitution, but is not a mandatory requirement.

A RULING OF the judicial council, the supreme court of the Methodist Church, brightened the hopes of some areas of the church that time will be given to work out this racial structure. This gives at least a six-year breathing period for finding solutions to the

racial problem, particularly in the Southeastern Jurisdiction composed of nine Southeastern states.

The majority of the Central (all-Negro) Jurisdiction is in the nine-state Southern area.

After the vote for union by both bodies, EUB Bishop Reuben J. Muellen of Indianapolis, and Bishop Lloyd Wicke of New York's Methodist area expressed confidence the plan of union would

be approved by annual conferences.

"It is a rather timid move in the right direction, and I

hope it will be an incentive for a longer stride in the direction of church unity," Bishop Wicke said.

# Pastoral care counseling offered at Pell City church

Thanks to a new partnership between the Pell City First United Methodist Church and the Methodist Board of Pastoral Care, Pell City has a new pastoral counselor, the Rev. Denise Jacks.

Rev. Jacks, who will be working at the church every Thursday, said she will be available for anyone who might need counseling for any reason.

Those reasons might include family relationship or marital problems or substance abuse problems, she said. "I will be available for really any problem someone might have," she said.

The only difference in a pastoral counselor and some other type of counselor is that a pastoral counselor has a theological degree.

She has a master's of divinity from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas.

She completed a two year clinical pastoral education program at Baptist Medical Center Princeton in Birmingham and is currently completing several other training courses in counseling.

She works at Carraway Methodist Medical Center and with UAB Hospice as a chaplain. She will continue with her responsibilities there, as well as doing the new program at FUMC.

Rev. Jacks, who started the counseling program at the church three weeks ago, said there will be a fee for her services, but it will be negotiable based on the client's income.

"Some people might need to come in for just a few sessions, but others might need long-term care," she said.

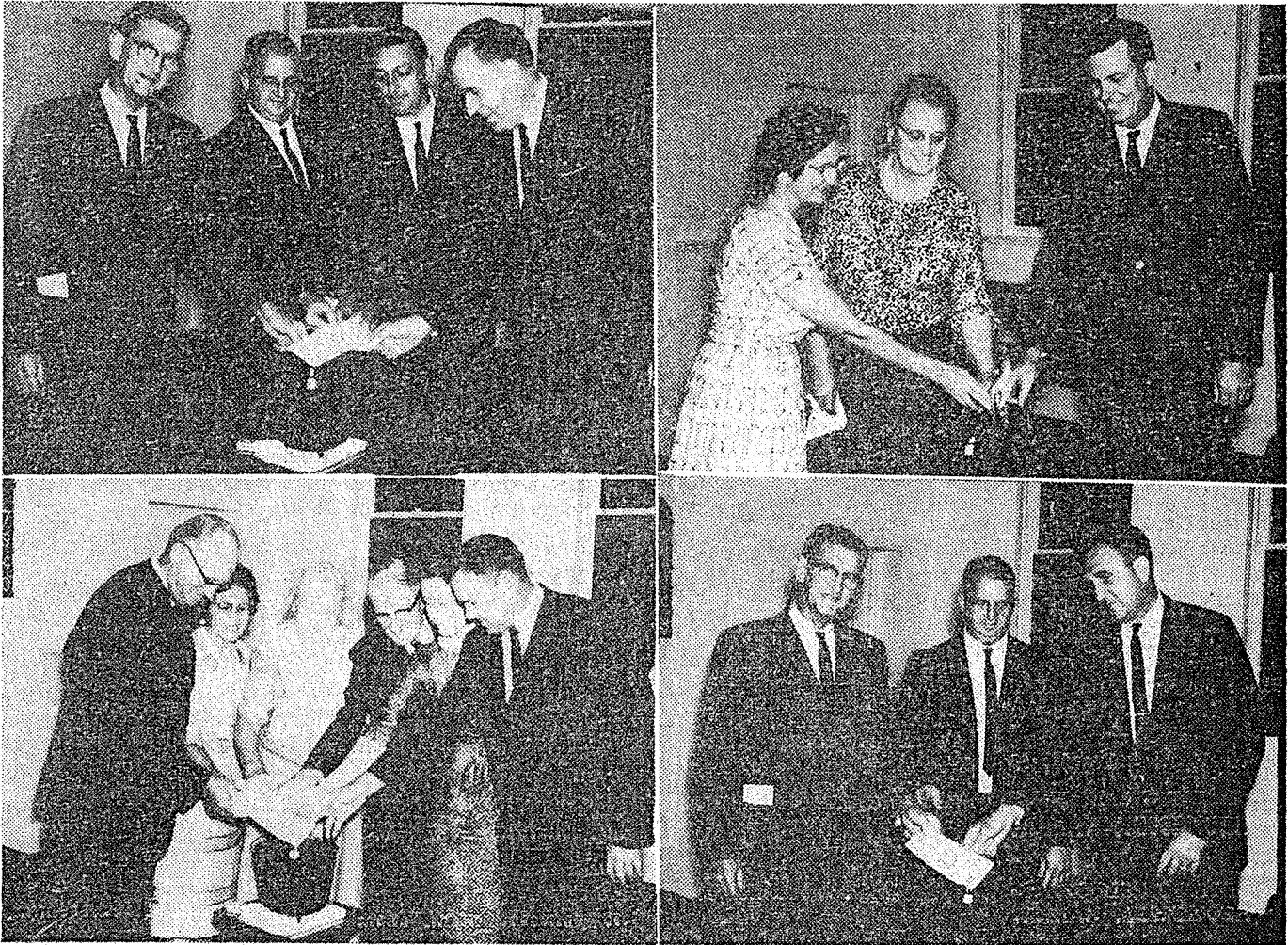

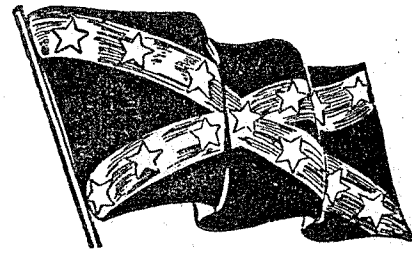

## METHODIST ORGANIST HONORED FOR 29 YEARS SERVICE ... Mrs. Jewell Matthews, Shown With Daughters, Church Officials

According to the Rev. Wayne Graham's arithmetic, Mrs. Jewell Matthews has officially played the Pe'l City First Methodist Church organ for 6,290 services since she became the Church Organist 29 years ago.

Rev. Graham, First Methodist pastor, figures this on a basis of 100 services per year, 52 Wednesday nights per year, 1 revival per year, 100 weddings and 100 funerals, plus 1450 Sunday School Assemblies. "And all this without pay," adds Rev. Graham admiringly.

In recognition of this out-

standing service to the church, Mrs. Matthews was honored at a special ceremony during last Sunday's services, at which time it was announced that 300 new hymnals were being purchased for the church in honor of Mrs. Matthews and her late husband, L. L. Matthews, who was choir director of the Church for a number of years prior to his death.

On hand for the ceremony were Mrs. Matthews' daughters, Mrs. Ben Meadows of Atlanta and Mrs. Herbert Rushton of Hattiesburg, Miss., who pre-

sented the Church a check for \$450.00, half the cost of the hymnals. The other half was paid out of Church treasury.

The ceremony and the dedication of the hymnals had been a well-kept secret and came as a complete surprise to Mrs. Matthews.

## First United Methodist founded in 1902

In the 91 years Pell City First United Methodist Church has been in existence, it has grown from 14 members to 700.

The church was originally founded in 1902 as First Methodist Episcopal Church South and services were held in a white frame building. The present church building was erected in 1925 and in 1968, the church joined with the Evangelical United Brethren to form the United Methodist Church.

During the Great Depression, the women of the church served meals to pay for the church pews. The pews, which were handcrafted, are unique because they curve.

When the church sanctuary was renovated this past year, the members took special measures to refurbish the pews and the stained glass windows that have been donated in memory of past members.

The pastor of the church is the Rev. Don Cross, and Dr. Ed Sims serves as associate pastor. The minister of music is Dr. Ovide DeLage, who is the head of the Music Department at the University of Montevallo.

First United Methodist has several activities for its members, including, several for the children and youth.

Two new programs at the church are the new day care for children, ages three weeks to three years of age and the Pastoral Care Program with the Rev. Denise Jacks.

Services are held on Sunday mornings at 9 and 11 with Sunday school at 9:50 a.m.

Sunday evening services are held at 6. There are several activities held throughout the week, including Bible study, women's clubs, parents day out, choir and Christian Outreach.

## History of The First Methodist Church of Pell City, Alabama

This history is taken from a talk given on Layman's Day February 17, 1963 by Mr. Blair Jones.

Mr. Jones states in the first part of his report, "Our Board Chairman, Mr. Robert Hardwick, gave me the pleasant task of securing data on the origin and formation of our Methodist Church. It is my pleasure to state that in addition to the letter of Mr. Cather, of which I have a copy, to Mrs. Ella Miller dated December 29, 1953, Bro. Hardiman loaned me three of the early church registers. The registers and Mr. Cather's letter have been especially helpful and I shall be quoting from them in this talk.

The beginning of our Church came after a meeting of twelve persons or less in the old Maxwell Building now occupied by Pell City Grocery, Scott Hardware and Larry's Record Shop. At the time of this meeting, the building was used as a hotel and the proprietors were Mr. & Mrs. "Ehort" Carroll Alverson, the grand parents of our good member, Mr. Jack Hazelwood. After this meeting, a Sunday School was organized in Mr. Cather's print shop. This was sometime during the year of 1902, 61 years ago. The Sunday School grew which necessitated a move to the schoolhouse. The result of these meetings was that in the latter part of 1902 our Church was organized, and became a unit of the North Alabama Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church, South. The early register discloses that on December 1, 1902, Rev. E.E. Emerson became our first pastor and that the membership consisted of fourteen members. Among these fourteen members were Mr. Bays D. Cather, who came from Ashville to establish our first newspaper, The Coosa Valleyan on March 16, 1904, and Miss D. Kilgroe and Mr. & Mrs. W. H. Miller, the parents of our faithful Villie May Yarbrough.

Then, in the fall of 1903, Mr. & Mrs. J. H. Walker and five other names were added. Mr. & Mrs. J. H. Walker were the parents of our good members, Misses Mary Francis and Martha Walker. The following year, 1904, eleven people joined the church. In 1905, the church received many new members and consistently began to grow.

Bro. Emerson, the first pastor, was succeeded by the Reverends Aldridge, Hensly, Hamby, Bagan, Howard, and the saintly Joshua Warren whom I knew personally. In fact, he married Miss Dixie and me. From Bro. Warren down through the years we have had some outstanding ministers including our capable pastor of the present time, Bro. Hardiman.

It is noted that the first marriage in our Church was performed by Rev. E. E. Emerson May 3, 1903 at which time Mr. J. F. Miller married Miss Eddie Rowland. They were the uncle and anunt of Mrs. Willie May Yarbrough. Also, it is noted that Frank Miller, their son, was baptized by Rev. E. E. Emerson in December, 1904, and probably the same Sund Jack Hazelwood's two sisters, Marie and Foy, were baptized. I shall not disclose all the baptismal dates round in the register as some of the ladies present might object. I know that Jack Hazelwood will not mind so I will tell you that he was baptized by Rev. Joshua Warren on September 26, 1913. On the same Sunday, a brother and sister of Jack were paptized.

I have been unable to find the exact year in which the frame church building was erected. The circumstantial evidence indicates that it was built soon after the church was organized in 1903. It was demolished on the lot where our present church now stands. It is my information that this lot was denoted by Mr. & Mrs. Sumpter Cogswell.

It is with much pride that I can say that our Church has contributed spiritually and materialiy to the growth of our town and that its influence has extended far and wide.

Statistical data is always dry and uninteresting; however, I am hopeful that some of us has found some points of interest which will instill in all of us to continue now and in the future the good work begun so humbly in 1902 by our founders.

## About Early Church Life in Pell City

(The following is a brief resume of the early church life in Pell City written by Bays D. Cather Sr, former editor and publisher of the The Pell City News. Mr. Cather gave this report in a recent letter to Mrs. Ella Miller, of Pell City, who wrote him several weeks ago asking for this information for the First Methodist Church here.)

"When I moved to Pell City in January 1902 there was no church or Sunday School.

If you remember correctly, my printing establishment was at first located in a building that stood back of the present Pell City Drug Co., building.

The first Sunday School was a Union Sunday School and was organized by Mrs. Carol Alverson, and myself, and we had help from Mr. W. H. Miller, Mr. Fred Miller and from many others of the population of Pell City at that time. We arranged nail kegs and boxes in the print shop and held services in there, using the kegs and boxes for seats. Afterwards we started holding church services in the same building on Sunday night.

Later we organized a Methodist Sunday School with the help of the presiding Elder who was then stationed at Gadsden. I believe his name was Robinson, but I am not so sure now. Later the people of Pell City with the help of Sumter Cogswell, W. H. Miller and many others, built a little school house, the little building which in later years became the Episcopal Church (the Church of St. Mary the Virgin is the name the congregation gave it when they took the building over) and Bishop Beckwith of the Alabama Diocese would come there and hold services. Dr. Blacklock, of Anniston was chosen as Rector of that church.

In the meantime the Methodist congregation was organized by the Millers, the Alversons, and myself, and a Methodist church building was erected where the present new church building stands. I was church clerk, a steward and secretary of the Sunday School, then appointed by the Quarterly conference. We chose A. E. Ledyard as our choice for superintendent of the Methodist Sunday School, and later I was appointed by the con-

ference as superintendent. I think my name is among the first names on the old Church register of members.

E. E. Emerson was our first pastor sent by the North Alabama Conference. He was a pioneer, and Pell City was in the Eden Circuit at first, being pastor at Eden as well as Pell City. He also had at that time the old Fishing Creek Church at Seddon, and I believe he held services at Riverside.

I was very much interested in the church and along with all you good folks we had some fine experiences.

Later the Baptists organized a Pell City congregation and built their building where the new beautiful church building now stands.

I would be very neglectful if I failed to mention the fact that the Pell City Manufacturing Co., owners of the textile mills in Pell City, contributed in many ways to the financial assistance of all the churches, and that the people in Mill made up a good part of the congregations.

Pell City had the reputation of being the "friendly city" in that section and this friendly and helpful spirit paid-off in bringing some of the best people in the world to settle in your town.

I feel thankful for the small part I played in the history of the Church and Christian work in St. Clair County.

From a small boy on up I was active in Christian work. I served at Ashville as Sunday School Secretary, Superintendent and teacher of classes.

I have some old photos of a children's day exercise we had at Ashville Church when I was superintendent and some of those children are living useful Christian lives in many places. Some have passed into the great beyond but their memory is very sacred to me.

In Pell City it seemed very lone some without a church and with other good people there we soon got the good work going".

I wish you would express mine and Mrs. Cather's Christian love and good wishes to all our old friends that are left there.
