Group forms first Presbyterian church in Pell City

Bedsole said about 60 people attended services the first week and it has stayed around that average since.

The Rev. Dan Allison from Birmingham has been holding the services through the month of October.

First Presbyterian is a mission of Evangelic Presbyterian and is part of the Presbyterian Church of America, Bedsole said.

The new church meets at 10 a.m. on Sundays and has home Bible study on Wednesday evenings.

Ron Landree and Alan Haynes are the other to elders of the church.
