Jake Garry, City Pioneer Laid To Rest

One of Pell City's first citizens died last week.

Jake Garry, one of the very best known men in this area died last Friday in a Birmingham hospital. He was 88 years old. He was active in business until a few years ago when ill health forced him to give up his work.

He was a native of Lithunaia then a part of the Russian Empire. His parents were Mr. and Mrs. Sol Gary.

He came to this country with his parents at a young age, settled in Pell City in 1903 to live the rest of his life. Reports have it that he came to Pell City one day after the arrival here of the late Dr. R. A. Martin.

During his active business life he was a landowner, bought and sold Pell City property in the early days of this city. However, his main inteest in latter years was as a dealer in livestock. He also owned and operated a Livery stable for many years.

Graveside funeral services were held Friday morning at Knesseth Israel cemetery in Birmingham. Rabbi Moshe Stern officiated.
