Married Tabitha Brewer, born February 1800 and died August 7, 1880. He also had nine children by the second marriage. His son by his first wife, Robert Douglass Ginn, born Feb 26, 1804, died March 27, 1841 - They were the parents of Reuben Ginn born December 4, 1839, died April 11, 1893, married November 8, 1860, Martha Douglass, born Jan. 4, 1834. Died May 26, 1899, and their children were: John Andrew Ginn, born August 16, 1861, whowas living in St. Clair county in 1942 but had died before April 1, 1945, and who married June 14, 1896, Cynthia Foote; Laura Elizabeth, born April 19. 1866, died Feb 17, 1898, married William H. Wright, Feb. 23, 1888; David Moses, born March 20, 1869, married Lena Corner, June 27, 1897; Alonzo Jackson, born Nov. 27, 1871, married Ola Hammond, Nov. 10, 1891; Joseph Ruben, born Nov. 25 1874, died unmarried April 4, 1895; Robert Lee, born January 3, 1878 - died Oct 25, 1908; Sarah Elberta, born June 8, 1888, unmarried. In the name of God Amen - I Jesse Ginn of St. Clair County & State of Alabama being in bad health and weak in body but in perfect mind & calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that its appointed unto men once to die dom make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say after my just debts being paid the balance of my property I give and bequeath to my wife Tabitha to have and to hold during widowhood or life time for the purpose of raising my children having given to my first Children a small portion of my estatu to commence the world with that is some stock & household funniture wishing to do equal justice to all my children if any of them now living with me shall marry before the death or intermarriage of my wife I wish them to have something near an equal shear with them that are married provided they can without disfurnishing the widow & the ballance of my children & wish my property to be kept together with the exceptions above named during my wife's widowhood or lifetime then to be equally divided among my children first giving to them not of age nor married equal shear with them that are married the remaining part to be equally divided as them and their Executors may think profitable either by a sale or a division among themselves further more should my wife Tabitha Ginn marry them she can take a third or a childs part as she may think proper & I do further appoint & ordain Reuben Dollar & John Cellins Executors of my last Will and Testament and I do now revoke all other Wills or Testaments and I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th day of Nevember in the Year of Lord 1840.

Reuben Ginn, youngest child of Jesse Ginn and Tabitha Brewer Ginn, was horn Dec. 4, 1838, about three miles below what is now called Eden, (St. Clair County), Alabama, in Township 17, Section 9, Range 3 East; at that time it was called the Tuscaloosa Land District. Their home was near Wolf Creek. (Eden is on Wolf Creek).

(Alabama is laid off like a city; if one knows how these townships, sec-

tions, and ranges run, they can find any place in the State).
Reuben Ginn was one and one-half years old when his father, Jesse Ginn,

died April 8, 1840.

When Reuben Ginn was twenty-two years of age he married Martha Jane Douglas, daughter of Robert Douglas and Martha Taylor Douglas, on November 8, 1860 at Eden, Ala. They were married at the home of her uncle, David Taylor, who had raised her.

It was not long before the outbreak of the Civil War. On April 16, 1862, Reuben Ginn enlisted in the Confederate Army, and was sent to Camp

Curry, near Talladega, Alabama.

Renben Ginn and his brothers, Jesse Ginn, William Ginn, Jackson Ginn; his brothers-in-law Housley Cox, Samuel Cowan, William Cowan, and his wife's brothers (brothers-in-law also), James Douglas, William Douglas, Robert Douglas, and Frank Douglas, all left the same day for Camp Curry, Talladega, Alabama.

Reuben Ginn served through the four years of war without being wounded. He was a litter bearer (stretcher bearer); he picked up the wounded

from the battle field.

He was in the 30th Alabama Regiment most of the four years, in Company H, under Captain Woodward, later Captain Burr, Bartens Brigade,

Stevesons Division.

At the end of the war Reuben Ginn had only forty acres of land he had inherited from his mother. He was a successful farmer, and by 1880 he owned three or four hundred acres of land. About this time he made a bad business deal (most people would call it that), and lost most every thing he had. He died almost penniless.

There is an old Indian Legend mixed up in this business deal which, as Bob Ripley would say "Believe it or not", must be so.
The Legend, as told by the Indians is something like this: When De-Soto and his men came through this part of Alabama, the Indians were living here on Dry Creck, on this last eighty acres of land Reuben Ginn bought. (The legend is about this 80 acres). The Indians had a town here (they left many remains). The Spaniards stopped here for some time with these Indians, and they treated the Indians so terribly that the Indians prayed to their God, or Great Spirit to never let white men prosper here where the Indians had to suffer so at their hands. Chief Tuscaloosa, in Southern part of the State, sent DeSoto word he wanted to see him, but DeSoto and his men waited so long to go to meet Tuscaloosa, that the Chief sent his son with a second message (history tells us), which seems to prove the legend was so.

You can believe this legend or not, as you please, but white men have never prospered, who bought this eighty acres of land. They soon lose it

and the other property they owned previously.

Here is a little description of this land as we remember it as a child.

The deed (first deed) is "Sheep skin", and is signed by President James Monroe, the date is May 1824. This first deed is made to Mr. Henry Tracener; he got it through the Tuscaloosa Land Company, and it is recorded in


