September 27, 1894: Died on Thursday, Claud **Turner**, infant son of Thomas Turner, the family have the sympathy of the entire community.

September 27, 1894: A Strange Death. On last Monday evening Mr. Jim Evans who lives near Ragland, saw the horse and cart of Dr. H. H. Brewster passing his field, and thinking the Doctor had stopped at his, Evans', house, he went out to stop the horse, when to his horror he found the Doctor laying in the cart dead. One of his feet had been rubbed by the wheel until it had nearly wore a hole in his shoes. It is thought that the horse had came over a mile and a half after the Doctor died. Dr. Brewster was a prominent physician. He leaves a family and large circle of friends to mourn his death, which was supposed to be the result of heart failure.

October 11, 1894: Odenville. Mrs. Parthenia **Mize** died last week. She leaves a husband and five or six little children who have our sympathies.

October 11, 1894: Odenville. Rev. R. H. Ramsey died last Sunday at Branchville.

November 8, 1894: Died on last Friday morning, Leity, the wife of Walter Montgomery. Mrs. Montgomery leaves a husband and five small children to mourn her death, the bereaved family have the sympathy of the entire community in their sad loss. The remains were intered at the Ashville cemetery Saturday evening.

November 15, 1894: Beaver Valley. We are sorry to note the recent death of Miss Mollie **Dean**, who died the 12th, and was interred at Friendship church. She was fifty-three [years] old.

November 22, 1894: On last Saturday night near Pell City John T. Hays and John W. Brown shot and killed D. M. Karr. They were arrested and placed under guard to be brought to Ashville and lodged in jail, but Hays made his escape. Brown is now in jail at this place. We failed to learn the cause of the tragedy.

December 13, 1894: Died, October 7, 1894, Gregory Montgomery Capshaw, the little four year old son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Capshaw. "One by one we'll all be gathered home."

December 20, 1894: Died on Sunday the 16, Mrs. Neil **Gilmore**, of Birmingham. Mrs. Gilmore and family were for a long time residents of Ashville, and she had many friends at this place. Her remains were interred at the Ashville cemetery on last Monday eve.

January 10, 1895: On last Friday night the infant child of Mr. and Mrs. H. H. R. Wilson died, near Ashville.

Custodial School Man Jailed

SPOKANE — The recreation director at the Lakeland Village custodial school was jailed Friday on a charge of grafting, a gross misdemeanor.

The complaint was filed in justice court against Oliver Benjamin Karr, 59, and charged him with asking a percentage kickback in a 'band instrument transaction with the school at Medical Lake, Wash., a state institution.

The complaint alleges Karr represented he could influence decisions of public officials at the school in connection with purchase of the instruments.

Justice Gordon Lower set bond at \$1,000 and scheduled a hearing for next Thursday. Chief Deputy Prosecutor John Lally said state officials had accepted a \$1,700 bid from a Spokane music store for the instruments and that Karr admitted asking the store for a percentage.

Lally said Karr told him he had received 10 per cent of a \$7,000 music instrument transaction while teaching in the Grand Coulee, Nespelem and Elmira schools and that he had an "agreement" with dealers when he taught on the coast.

The deputy prosecutor said an attempt was made to get \$25 from the Spokane store last week and that store officials consulted his office.

The History Of Lakeland Village (Lakeland Village, Medical Lake Washington)

In January of 1915, Lakeland Village, known then as the "School for the Feeble Minded," was opened at its present site. 252 males moved by horse-drawn wagon from the old site on the grounds of Eastern Washington Hospital for the Insane (Eastern State Hospital) where they has been housed since 1906. Prior to 1906 the only facility for the "feeble minded" was the School for Defective Youth in Vancouver, established in 1892.

Female residents moved to the new site in February 1917. The Population increased to 620 by 1918 and reached an all-time high of 1654 in 1938. The farm operation produced all vegetables, grain and ensilage used by the institution, 60% of the eggs, all pork, all milk and cream.

In 1939 Western State Custodial School was built on the west side of Washington. (Rainier School at Buckley). The state was then divided geographically and Lakeland was renamed Eastern State Custodial School. The change in name to Lakeland Village occurred in 1947

The facility has undergone many changes both physically and philosophically through the years. Old dormitory style buildings were remodeled several times and then finally replaced with smaller cottage style homes. The population has decreased to 259 (February 2001). The purpose of the facility has changed from care and custody for the "the happiness of children" to providing active treatment for habilitation to an adult population.

Chance, Intensive Search Reunite 2 After 53 Years

O. E. Karr of Second St., Thermalito, last week was reunited with a brother he had not seen or heard from for 53 years. The brother, O. B. (Ben) Karr of Spokane, Wash., came to Oroville with his wife and her family to visit Mr. and Mrs. Karr of Thermalito. The brothers

lost contact with each other when they left the family home in Oklahoma in 1908 and neither learned what had happened to the other until the local couple was able to locate Ben through a chance lead on his whereabouts. Mrs. O. E. Karr last year as president of the local chapter of American Gold Star Mothers, attended a conference of that organization in Oakland. On being introduced there, the president of the Oakland chapter commented on her name and mentioned having known an O. B. Karr who had been teaching band in high school at Rolla, N. D. Mrs. Karr immediately identified the band teacher as her husband's brother. He had been her band teacher when she was in school in Oklahoma.

When she told her husband what she had learned, the search began and through various hometown newspapers in localities where Ben had lived and taught music, they were able finally to contact him in Spokane. The Washington man then planned the trip here with his wife and two daughters, Mary and Diane, his wife's mother and a niece, both from Minnesota. The two brothers spent a week together comparing events that had occurred during more than half a century of separation. Not the least among surprises learned by the band teacher was that his brother had married one of his former pupils.

Stu's Notes: There is a memorial plaque for WWII at Chico State University, I know because it took me a while to find it, sadly Lt. Cary's name is not on it, maybe because he only went there a year. He was forgotten. Our Memorial will put his name in stone. Mrs. O. E. Karr was a Gold Star Mother because she lost her son, Corporal Everett M. "Cotton" Karr, October 16, 1951 while fighting in North Korea. He was a member of the 90th Field Artillery Battalion, 25th Infantry Division. He was awarded, Posthumously, the Purple Heart, Korean Service Medal, United Nations Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal and the Korea War Service Medal. Note that the Korea War Service Medal, yes it was a War, even if the Government didn't often say that. His sister Nancy Karr Wilson and her husband Joe, still lives in Oroville.

"Whitaker State Children's Home, located in the southeast section of Pryor Creek.... was founded in 1897 by W. T. Whitaker, a Cherokee Indian, to care for the white orphans left behind in the Great-Oklahoma-Land-Rush. The children were cared for at Mr. Whitaker's own expense until 1906. Although there were numerous donations, the opeartion of the Home depleted Mr. Whitaker's entire resources. In 1903 the Cherokee Orphan Home in Salina burned and the children were taken to the Whitaker Orphan Home. In 1906 an act of Congress provided funds to care for the Indian orphan children. The First Legislature after Oklahoma became a State enacted a law which authorized the State to take over the Whitaker Orphan Home in Pryor Creek in 1908." Under direction of the state Board of Affairs it operated as an orphanage until 1961. As of 1977 it continued to operate as a home for neglected, delinquent, and otherwise unadoptable children. -- from "Historical Highlights of Mayes County"
