>October 22, 1908: Just at the close of day on Oct. 5th, 1908, John Leonard **Vandegrift**, one of St. Clair's most prominent citizens passed away at his home at Branchville, Ala., following a lingering illness, the beginning of which dated back twelve months, he having had a stroke of paralysis a year ago, from the effects he never recovered.

John Leonard Vandegrift was born in St. Clair County, Ala., Oct. 25th, 1836, and lived and died within a few miles of his birthplace. He was a Confederate soldier, having fought bravely through four long years of the Civil war. He was also a faithful and honored member of the Presbyterian church from boyhood. He was a prominent member of the Odd Fellows with whose impressive service he was laid to rest at Liberty, Wednesday morning Oct., 7th, 1908.

On Oct. 29, 1965, Mr. Vandegrift was married to Mary L. Braden, who survives him. To them was born ten children, nine of whom survive him: Mrs. L. S. Stovall, Mrs. P. A. Glenn, Miss Alma Vandegrift, Finis and Delphus Vandegrift, all of Branchville, Ala. Mrs. A. W. Veasey and J. B. Vandegrift of Birmingham, Ala., Mrs. T. N. Wilson of Meridian, Miss., and L. Eugene Vandegrift of Nashville Tenn. He is survived by two sisters and one brother, Mrs. Judge Box of Birmingham, Ala., Mrs. Sara Byram of Cullman, Ala., and A. S. Vandegrift of Los Angeles, Cal.

Mr. Vandegrift will be missed. He was a man of unswerving loyalty to his family, his friends and his convictions. His private life was pure, and his public life was open and honest. He was a man of noble impulses.

Pell City Progress, 1908
Pell City, Alabama

April 2, 1908: On Thursday, March 26th, at 10 o'clock, occurred the death of Mr. W. H. Miller,

one of Pell City's most prominent and respected citizens. His death, while not wholly unexpected, came as a shock to his many friends. His end came as the result of an operation, performed on him last January, for cancer of the stomach. The incision never healed and the spread of the cancer could not be stopped. He was never, after the operation, able to take any nourishment and in consequence his vitality was gradually sapped away. He is survived by his wife, his father, four children, two sisters and three brothers. His remains were laid to rest at the cemetery in Eden on Friday, the burial services being conducted by the Odd Fellows and K. of P. Lodges.

During his life time Mr. Miller was very prominent in business circles and in the public affairs of Pell City. He was a justice of the peace and served on the city council and school board for a number of years. Until just before his death he owned and conducted the general merchandise firm of W. H. Miller & Co. He was a member of several of the fraternal orders and has held high offices in each. He was in all respects a public spirited citizen and gave a good part of his time to the upbuilding of Pell City. His loss will be felt by many who knew and loved him for his kindness and the interest that he took in pushing Pell City to the front. The heartfelt sympathy of his hosts of friends go out to the bereaved family.

His condition was greatly improved on his return, and his death, while not entirely unexpected, came as a blow to his family and many friends. Toombs County was created August 19, 1905 with land taken from Emanuel, Montgomery and Tattnall counties. Toombs county was named for Robert Augustus Toombs, C.S.A. General and Secretary of State. He was born in 1810 and died in 1885. He attended the University of Georgia and Union College in New York. He practiced law, served in the legislature and in the US Congress and Senate. At first a Whig, he became a reluctant Democrat and then finally a secessionist. Toombs was associated with Howell Cobb and Alexander Stephens in much of his legislative career and was one of the wealthiest planters in Georgia in 1860. He was sent as a delegate to the convention at Montomerv and he accepted the position of Secretary of State with some hesitation because he had wanted to be president. He found that his office was not only a subordinate but also an idle one.

He resigned to become Brigadier General of the Confederate States of America July 19, 1861 and to take over the Georgia brigade in Virginia, retaining his seat in the C.S.A. Congress. A fiery volunteer, he wanted to engage the Union forces immediately and rebuked the caution of the professional soldiers. He said upon several occasions that the Confederacy would be "died or vest of it." After the Marston Hill, Virginia battle on July 1, 1862, Daniel Harvey Hill, C.S.A. General from South Carolina, reprimanded Toombs for allowing his troops to break ranks and not rallying them, and Toombs demanded satisfaction. Toombs' attitude brought yet another reprimand. At Antietam he was severely wounded, but his brigade held the stone bridge in a valiant performance. When no promotion was received, he resigned on March 4, 1863. Toombs spent most of the rest of the war carping at the government's errors and oppressions, and was defeated in a bid for the C.S.A. Senate. But when Sherman advanced on Atlanta Toombs was named Division Adjutant and Inspector General in the Georgia Militia. Barely escaping arrest in May of 1865, he fled to Cuba and England, later on returning to build a large law practice. Toombs never asked for pardon under Reconstruction laws. Just when he seemed to have repaired the damages to his fortune, his private life became a series of tragedies: his wife died insane and he became blind and began to drink to excess.

The B'ham Family History Center does not have the death cert. film for Robert Toombs Miller in inventory, so it can be ordered for \$3.40 or you can request a death cert from the State of Alabama for about \$12.50. Some of these certs. are not completely filled in, and many times where it asks for parent info the dreaded "unknown" is all there is, especially when the report was made by an MD in a hospital.

Of the Ida Millers listed, there were 2 films in. the first was for Ida Lee Miller, not yours, the second was for Ida Lillian Miller, so you were lucky there.
