Eugene Vandegrift of Nashville Tenn. He is survived by two sisters and one brother, Mrs. Judge Box of Birmingham, Ala., Mrs. Sara Byram of Cullman, Ala., and A. S. Vandegrift of Los Angeles, Cal.

Mr. Vandegrift will be missed. He was a man of unswerving loyalty to his family, his friends and his convictions. His private life was pure, and his public life was open and honest. He was a man of noble impulses.

Pell City Progress, 1908 Pell City, Alabama

April 2, 1908: On Thursday, March 26th, at 10 o'clock, occurred the death of Mr. W. H. Miller,

one of Pell City's most prominent and respected citizens. His death, while not wholly unexpected, came as a shock to his many friends. His end came as the result of an operation, performed on him last January, for cancer of the stomach. The incision never healed and the spread of the cancer could not be stopped. He was never, after the operation, able to take any nourishment and in consequence his vitality was gradually sapped away. He is survived by his wife, his father, four children, two sisters and three brothers. His remains were laid to rest at the cemetery in Eden on Friday, the burial services being conducted by the Odd Fellows and K. of P. Lodges.

During his life time Mr. Miller was very prominent in business circles and in the public affairs of Pell City. He was a justice of the peace and served on the city council and school board for a number of years. Until just before his death he owned and conducted the general merchandise firm of W. H. Miller & Co. He was a member of several of the fraternal orders and has held high offices in each. He was in all respects a public spirited citizen and gave a good part of his time to the upbuilding of Pell City. His loss will be felt by many who knew and loved him for his kindness and the interest that he took in pushing Pell City to the front. 

Toombs County and Robert A. Toombs History



Toombs County was created August 19, 1905 with land taken from Emanuel. Montgomery and Tattnell counties. Toombs county was named for Robert Augustus Toombs, C.S.A. General and Secretary of State. He was born in 1810 and died in 1885. He attended the University of Georgia and Union College in New York. He practiced law, served in the legislature and in the US Congress and Senate. At first a Whig, he became a reluctant Democrat and then finally a secessionist. Toombs was associated with Howell Cobb and Alexander Stephens in much of his legislative career and was one of the wealthiest planters in Georgia in 1880. He was sent as a delegate to the convention at Montgomery and he accepted the position of Secretary of State with some hesitation because he had wanted to be president. He found that his office was not only a subordinate but also an idle one

He resigned to become Brigadler General of the Confederate States of America July 19, 1861 and to take over the Georgia bridade in Virginia, retaining his seat in the C.S.A. Congress, A hery volunteer, he wanted to engage the Union horces immediately and revied the caution of the professional soldlers. He said upon several occasions that the Confederacy would be "died or viest moint. After the Marwin rim, virginal battle on July 1, 1852, Daniel Harvey Hill, C.S.A. General from South Carolina, reprimanded Toombs for allowing his troops to break ranks and not rallying them, and Toombs demanded satisfaction. Toombs' attitude brought yet another reprimand. At Antietam he was severely wounded, but his bridade held the stone bridge in a valiant performance. When no promotion was received, he resigned on March 4, 1863. Toombs spent most of the rest of the war carping at the government's errors and oppressions, and was defeated in a bid for the C.S.A. Senate. But when Sharman advanced on Atlanta Toombs was named Division Adjutant and Inspector General in the Georgia Militia. Barely escaping arrest in May of Todo, ne fled to Cube and England, rater on returning to pund a large law practice. Toombs never asked for pardon under Reconstruction laws. Just when he seemed to have repaired the damages to his fortune, his private life became a series of tragedies: his wife died insane and he became blind and hogan to drink to avecase.
