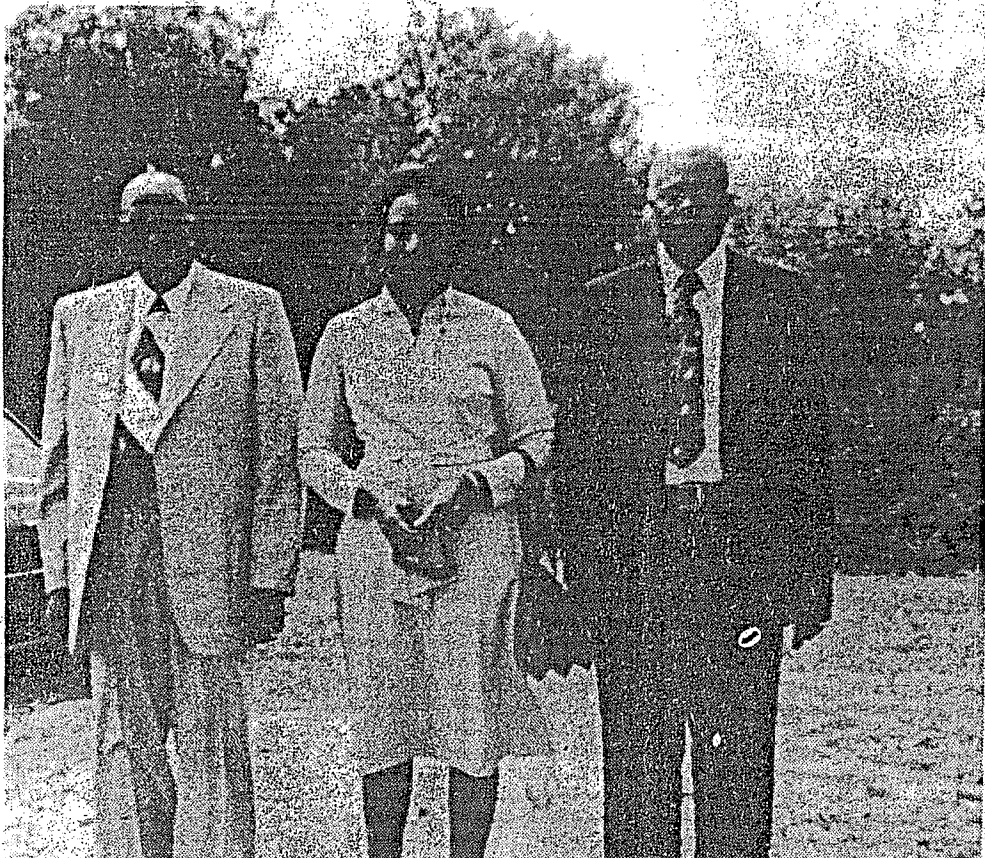

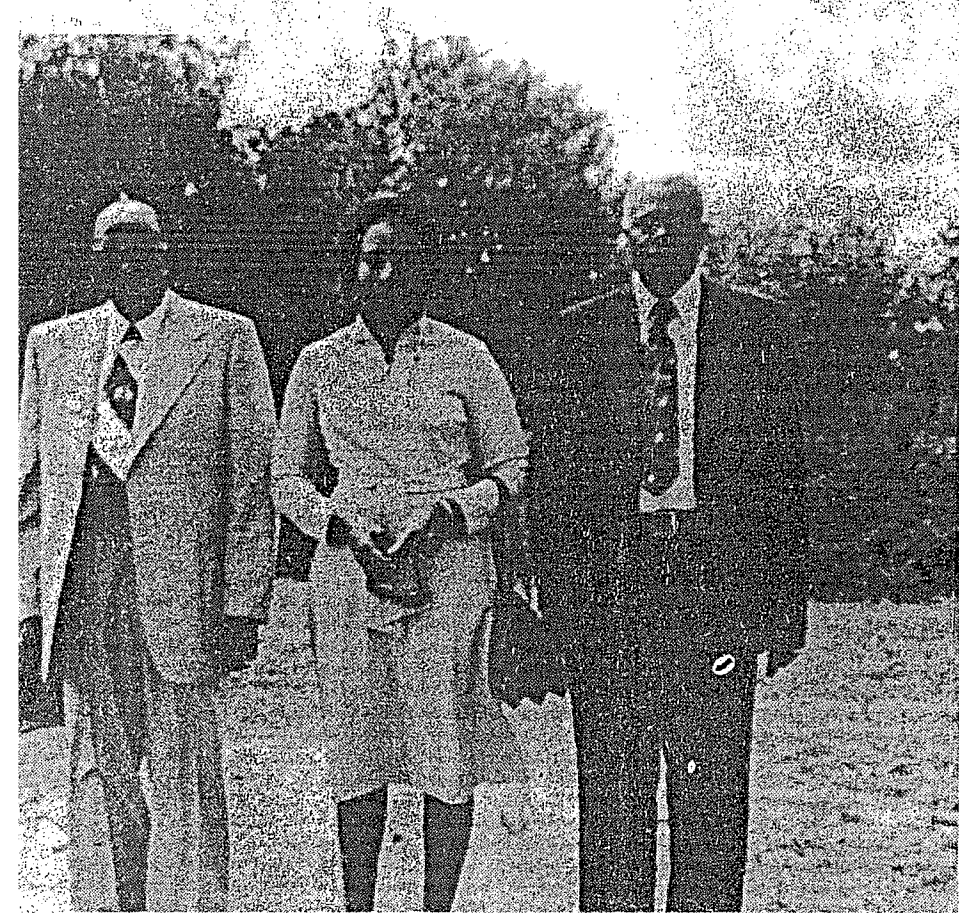

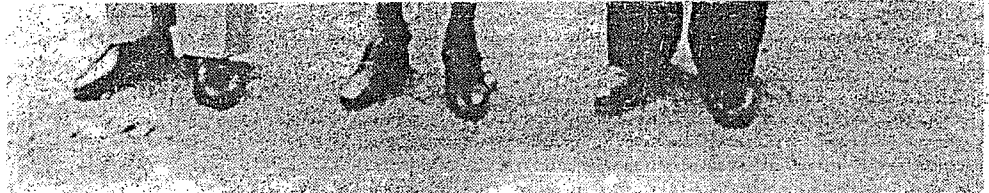

The past year we have labored, working hard and looking forward to going into the sanctuary. The members enjoyed a lovely occasion with visitors and many friends.

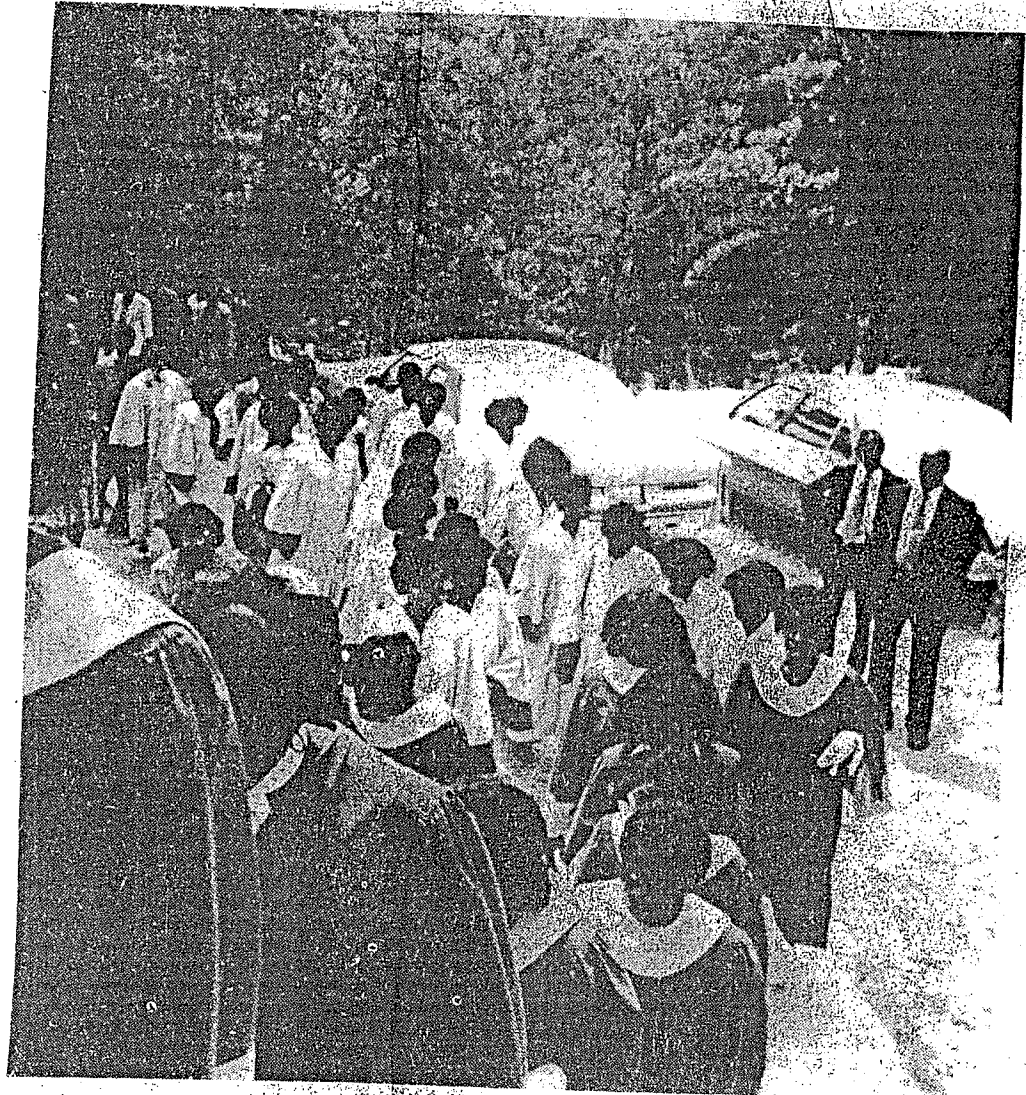

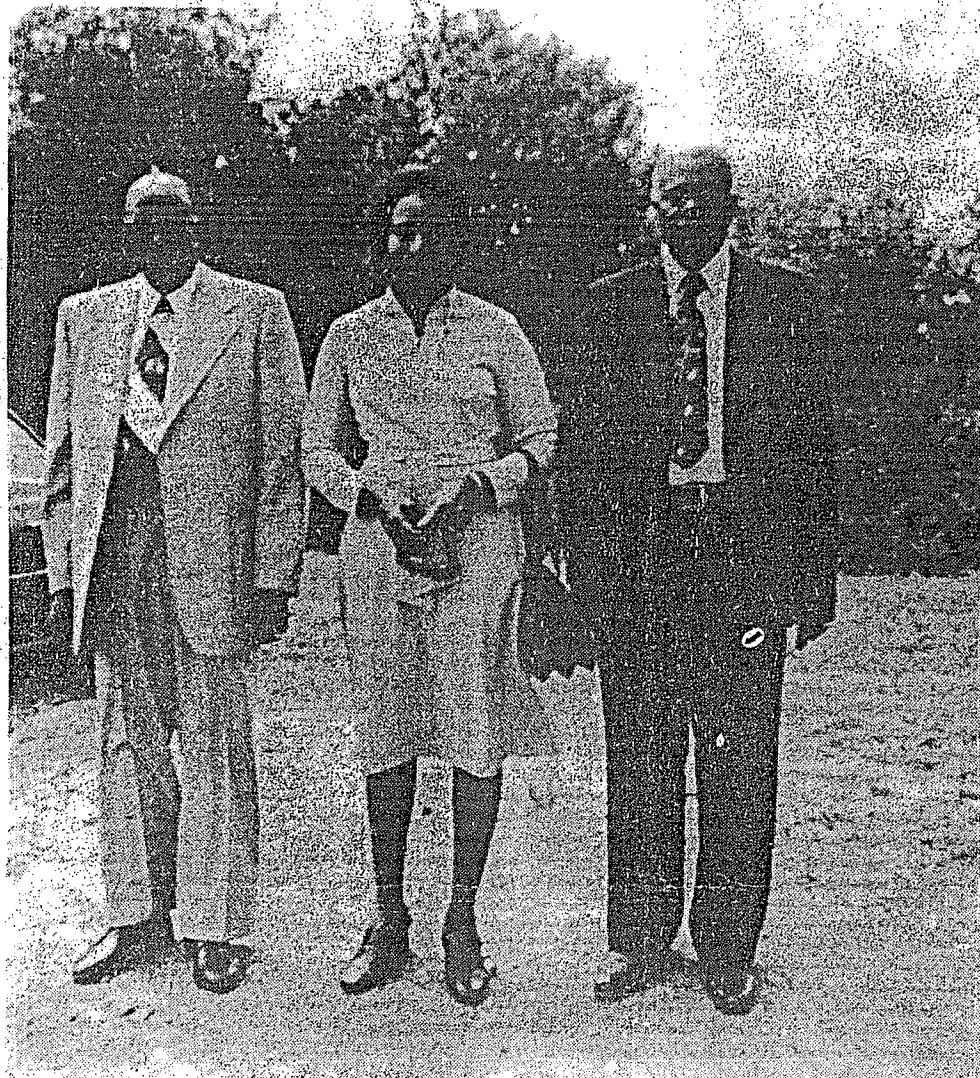
