Mr Thomas Mungall, pioneer resident of P.C. died at his home here last Friday. Uncle Tom, as he was known to a wide circle of friends had been in ill health for the past year.

Visiting in Lindale Ga. several months ago Mr Mungall suffered a stroke of paralysis and had been sinking steadily until his passing.

Funeral services were held last Sunday at 11 a.m. from the First Methodist Church. Past. officiating. H. H. Willingham & Co. was in charge.

Ben M Jacobs Masonic Lodge had charge of the rites.

Born in Glasgow Scotland in 1862 Mr Mungall came to the U.S. as a youth of 21 living first in Manchester, N.H. Went to work in Manchester for the Amoskeag Manufacturing Co. and rose to be partner of overseeing of dyeing.

Came to P.C. 32 years ago and for 21 years was overseer of dyeing here for Avondale Mills.

Member of Knights Templar, Clay McKenzie & member Westminster Presbyterian Church Manchester, Ben M Jacobs Masonic Lodge.

Possessed of a large library Uncle Tom was always interested in young people.
