FOREWORD

For several years I have been interested in family history. In an effort to obtain more information I have attempted in this book to place all the material I have together with the hope that it will recall additional facts to the minds of those persons who might read it. I realize the inaccuracy of this information and hope each person reading this material will send corrections and additions to me.

The information about the Weldon family was very "sketchy" when I started. My source of information has been members of the Weldon Clan, public libraries, official records and documents. I would like to express my deep vote of thanks to all that have contributed information about the Weldon family. These letters are a treasured part of my files on the Weldon family.

I have tried to base all information in this book on historical and actual facts and not on assumption. But I would like to deviate from that practice here and offer my observation on the Weldon family. Naturally a person like to boast of his family name but with all sincerity I have found the Weldons and their descendants a credit to the community in which they live. There is a strong family tie among Weldon families yet one branch of the family has lost trace of other branches. This trait is probably a product of migrating families of years gone by.

As I have stated this is written with a selfish motive. It is hoped that it will refresh memories and add additional information so that someday a complete record of the Weldon family may be compiled. In our modern times records are kept with great diligence, but it was only a few years ago that practically no records were available. So today we have to depend on patching together the information we are able to gather in order to picture the lives of our forefathers. Stories about the family come down from generation to generation and are often distorted after a number of years and it is hard to get an accurate description. Therefore no incident or piece of information so small as to be of no value.

CONCISE HISTORY OF THE WELDON FAMILY

Very little information is available about the origin of the Weldon family. The earliest records of the Weldon family come from Petersborough of Northant England, where it is listed as a local name. Some of the Weldon families and names of Northant were; Geoffrey Weldons, Lucas Weldon, Hugh Weldon, William Weldon and George Duke Weldon who married Philleppa _____. The book "FAIRBANKS CREST OF GREAT BRITIAN AND IRELAND" list crest of Weldon of Northant as a demi-lion rampart. The same book list crest for Weldon of Kent, Weldons Crest, and Weldon from Ireland.

As has been mentioned the name Weldon is of English origin. Although it belonged to Weldon of Northant England, in the 14th century and was spelled Weldon with some families adding the "E", there is an earlier record of the name. The name originated in the 13th century in England and was spelled Weledon. The name itself means "Dweller at the Spring Hill". In literal translation the name is derived from two words, the first "well" which means spring and the word "dun" which means hill.

It therefore appears that the spelling in common usage first was Weldon with some adding the E. The spelling Weldon is most commonly used in the United States although quite a few families use the spelling Welden. In several instances where the E spelling is used, records indicate that it was changed from the O to the E spelling. There are several families where a brother uses one spelling and another brother the other. In addition to these two and the original English spelling there are other variations such as Walden and Waldon.

From my own family and from at least two other sources in the South comes the story that seven brothers came from England to the United States and thus the start of the Weldon family in America. This may or may not be true but records are vague about the earlier Weldons in America. One of the first was a William Weldon who came to the States from England on the "BONA NOVA" in 1619. Records show him living in Colledge Land Virginia as late as January 23, 1624. The next records of any Weldons that I have are listed as some of the earlier settlers of Canterbury Connecticut in the late 1600's. These names include Elijah, Samuel, James, John and Thomas. These five along with William might be six of the seven brothers coming to the States, probably at different times. There was an Elijah Weldon living in Salisbury Connecticut, married to Ruth Wescott who was born in 1753. In Georgia there was an Elijah Bunell Weldon born in 1884 listed with nine children.

The above named Samuel Weldon married and had at least two daughters, Rebecca who married James Bird and Susanna who married Thomas Hann. The name is significant because another group of Weldons or descendants of the Connecticut Weldons were listed in North

Carolina in the middle 1700's. There were four of these Daniel, Pines, Moses and Samuel. Actually, old records list Moses as living in North Carolina in 1700 and later the persons sharing his estate as David, Betty and Nancy Weldon. Probated in the Wills of Union City South Carolina is the will of Moses Weldon, born 1777, died 1814. Of Pines Weldon the only record is the 1790 census of Halifax District North Carolina, which list him as head of the family.

In 1745 Daniel Weldon bought a tract of land from a Marmaduke Kimbrough and planted an apple orchard, later to be known as "Weldons Orchard". One of the main resources of Halifax District was the stilling of brandy from apples. In 1737 the courts ordered that someone be "Overseer of the Road from Weldon's Orchard to Mush Island" a distance of a few miles. This road exist today although it is a farm road, not a highway by any means. It is possible that a least a part of Mush Island might have been owned by Weldons. It is known that a John Jones of Northampton County N.C. left in his will, Lot 90 in the town of Halifax to his friend Samuel Weldon on June 24, 1759.

Of Samuel Weldon there is little known of where he came, but he was active in the history of Halifax Xounty North Carolina. The present town of Weldon N.C. was named for Samuel Weldon. From "HISTORY OF HALIFAX COUNTY" by W. C. Allen. Supt. Weldon Public Schools, published by the Cornhill Company, Boston in 1918 the following information is obtained about Samuel Weldon.

"A blacksmith in the North Carolina town of Weldon. Halifax District. The town of Weldon was named for him. He was appointed on Committee of Safety for Halifax District in 1774. Was appointed Second Major to command troops of Halifax District in 1776. In the same year was elected to represent Halifax District in the first Constitutional Convention of North Carolina. On November 12th, 1776 was appointed Second Major of a Battalion of volunteers, later made Lt. Colonel. Nothing much is known of where Samuel Weldon came but he often wrote of his brother-in-laws William and David Short, so it is assumed that the maiden name of his wife Penelope must have been Short. In probated wills of Halifax District for the year 1782, the will of Samuel is recorded listing wife, Penelope, two sons Benjamin and William and one daughter Martha"

It is assumed that the branch of the Weldon family about which I write are descendants of Samuel Weldon. It is known from the writing of Reece Weldon (to follow) that William Weldon was one of the earlier known Weldons of this family and there is a connection between this family and the Weldons of North Carolina. Benjamin and William Weldon listed later in this book are assumed to be the sons of Samuel Weldon of Weldon North Carolina. This is based on the information on hand that points to this being true. All descendants of Benjamin and William Weldon are based on facts furnished from various members of each family.

At the present writing some new information has been found that may shed more light on the descendants of Samuel Weldon. I have recently received a letter from Charles N. Weldon of Clarkston Georgia

in which he stated his grandfather was William John Weldon and his grandfather came to America and was a blacksmith by trade. This would fit in with the above mentioned Samuel Weldon and could be the William Weldon about which I write. When and if any additional information is uncovered it will be included in later pages of this material.

Also at this time the descendants of Benjamin Weldon have just been located and not too much is known about that family. What information I have has been included in this material but it is hoped that soon more information will be obtained in regard to this family and it too will be included. Part of this family migrated to Texas and it is possible that some of the families in the States of Oklahoma and Tennessee are part of this branch.

This earlier history of the Weldon family has been brought out because of the similarity of names in these earlier Weldon families and the names of the Weldons known today. William, James, Benjamin, and John are familiar given names. In later years George has been frequently used. As far female names the given name Martha or its variation is by far the most common. Rev. James Weldon of Georgia, who has done some research on Weldon family history says his records indicated the names William and James used commonly in all branches of the Weldon family.

It appears that the North Carolina branch of the Weldon family migrated into Georgia and then later to Alabama. One branch of the family migrated to Texas and some of these descendants can possibly be found in Tennessee. It also appears that there were different sets of Weldons coming into Alabama from Georgia. One group in in through the Northern end of the State and the other through the Southern end of the State. A remark I have heard from at least three sources is that there was Indian blood in the Weldon family, but as yet I have not been able to find any marriage into Indian descendants.

To understand some of the earlier history of the Weldon family the next few paragraphs are the writing of Reece Gideon Weldon. It seems the at one time he decided to do a sketch on the family and this is his complete writing. They are written on tablet paper in longhand and are now in the possession of Mrs. Jack Story (Minnie Weems Weldon) of Wilsonville Alabama.

"Reecy Gideon Weldon was borned in Franklin County Georgia on February 26, 1852. My father's name was George Washington Weldon. My mothers maiden name was Culbertson. She was the daughter of Alexander Culbertson. As to my fathers family I know but little. My Great-grandfather came from England and settled at Weldon North Carolina, and we suppose that is where the name originated but we do not know for certain. He was also a stockholder in the Weldon and Wilmington Railroad. It was first built on wodden timbers hewn out with axes. An old account says they got it built out some 10 or 20 miles, they had a picnic out at a spring and ask noted men around to make speeches and they started out on a train at 7 or 8 O'clock and got out that night at 8 PM, had speeches and started back at 6 AM the next morning

and arrived at 7 PM and did not have an accident during the trip.
(NOTE: I have read a very similar account in a history book in the Birmingham Public Library.)

When I was about one year old we moved 6 or 8 miles to near Carnsville court house where we lived three or four years, then we moved to Alabama. I can only remember a few things that occurred while in the State of Georgia, but I mention a few of these things that are so plain by impression on my mind. I remember our sweet little girl who had a small gravel sled and was hauling small pieces of broken crockery on it. Also the strawberry patch on the branch below the house. My father and W. D. Shirley caught a very large eel while seining and could not hold it. That impressed me. The old cotton press, and with horror I remember to have seen John Kelley drunk. Uncle Butler Culbertson gave me an old 20 cts. piece of silver, the first money I ever owned and I have kept it since, nor would I part with it under any circumstances.

And several other things that flash through my memory as visual as if it had first happened. And I write these things to show how a child's mind is often impressed when parents don't think them old enough to pay any attention to anything. Parents should begin to train the little mind at 6 months old and be careful with it as these things are lasting impressions and may so change to course of a child's life that it may be raised to higher plains or may be lowered to the very depth of degradation. Parents be careful with your children.

In the fall of 1856 Father sold out his home and moved to North Alabama. I remember the ferry at Altoona Georgia, the first train of cars I ever saw. Seeing the miners digging gold, grind rock and panning out the gold. I remember crossing the Coosa River above Gadsden. Father looked at the country around on Sand Mountain for a few weeks then rented a farm and made our crop. Not being satisfied with North Alabama he moved to Shelby County where he bought land in the fall of 1857, where I remained with my parents till I was 22 years old. Bear Creek being a small stream and narrow valley. I had no advantage in the way of schooling so necessary to the level of the young mind.

Then the war came on us and for 5 years school was overlooked as was the training of children to a great extent. Father having bought an old dilapidated homestead, there was a great deal to work to do such as clear up land, build fences and do many things. He did not get his farm in the plight it should have been till the breaking out of the war in 1861. Many incidents occurred in those five years that should be noticed that wrings sorrow to me yet. Though I was about 9 years old and oh how I suffered during those years. Some time my poor childish heart would almost be broken and I would go out and cry when one after another would have to leave. Father, Mother, Sister or Brother or sweet children watch him shoulder his gun and march out to the front to fight for what we all thought was a just cause.

It was then I bore so much pain hearing letters read from fathers of sons saying a brother or cousin were killed and that a son or father wounded as such a fight and the Newspaper telling of such a

victory with only a small loss, 1,000 or 2,000 killed and I have sat or lay on my bed at night and wondered in the newspaper men did not know some loving wife, mother, father or children or maybe all were not weeping over the death of each one of these one or two thousand killed. While I was only a small boy I was large enough to go to the postoffice which was ten miles away and get mail for all the people that lived on this road between the postoffice and my home. And young as I was then I could see the anxiety of every one who would always be at the gate waiting for their mail and all the sighs, aches and pains that would slip from every one as they would get their mail and the torture I suffered in those years. God helps man to meet that sorrow and his heart knows that he can never erase.

Finally the sad news came to us that our own dear father had to go, and to go the next day. This was too much for me. It seemed it would kill me to give him up and I wondered why a just God (and my parents had always taught me he was just) permitted all of this. And after I had cried myself to sleep that night, I woke the next morning to find myself face to face with the same trouble. And Father took his knapsack, one suit of clothes, bid us all goodbye and left us all alone in a new country. It was then and not really until then that I realized the necessity of my childish trouble and the great responsibility of a child to his Mother. But I had two brothers older than myself and hence I did not realize my responsibility as much as I did later. When my father left in the spring of 64 us boys went on and finished the crops.

Then my oldest brother took down with the fever and the next brother got thrown from a horse and his arm broken. And it was then I felt my great responsibility, for Father said to us before leaving, "boys make the crop and look after Mother and keep everyth ing just like it is and if I never return make a living for your Mother and yourselves". But while I was only 12 years old I faced things just as they came up. I would hire fodder pulled and things done and pay for it in something we could do without and I would cry over it and then would pick up new energy and go on and I succeeded in getting the crops all gathered and it was abundant too. And have seed in time, wheat sowed and went on repairing fences for the next crop.

And after it seemed years to me, but it was only a short while about 6 months, Father came home one night and how my poor soul leaped for joy when he hollered that old familiar holler that we for want of a better name called it "A Georgia Hollor", when one was off from home and had been out for any length of time and would holler when he got in hearing distance of home and our folks always knew that holler. Father came home with fever and worn out from ezposure and lay sick for several months but by this time the other boys had regained their health and we pushed froward with another crop. Father regained his health and in the course of time every-thing was running on as before.

At this time Father got up a little school for a lady Mrs. Dunlap and the older boys went to school while I worked on the farm, giving myself of rainy days and a while in the spring and fall or after crops was made. This calls to mind a sad accient that occured the spring of 1866 when Mr. Hix was killed by a small pony that Father

had swapped for and I claimed as mine, for all of us boys had our horses we claimed and attended. I had stayed at home that morning to help Father and Hix hitch the pony to plow and she did not seem to care for it and when they plowed a few rounds Father told me I might go on as the fuss was over. I started and went a few steps and was in the act of crossing the fence when the pony started and came right to me. Just before reaching me she slung Hix around before her and he fell off dead, never speaking and gasping for breath a few times. Suppose that some blood vessel was ruptured near his heart."

This was the end of the writing of Reece Weldon about the early history of the family of George Washington Weldon. This writing gives us some idea of the life of the Weldons in Shelby County Alabama. The old Bible of George Washington Weldon is now in the possession of William John Weldon of Wilsonville Alabama, from it we obtained the following information.

William A. Welden was borned July 27th 1848
Johnathan H. Welden March 2, 1850
Reza G. Welden was borned Febuary 26, 1852
George A. M. Welden. was borned October 26, 1857
Mahala Ann Welden was born May 21, 1863
Luticia Welden

These dates and names are very interesting for two special reasons. The first is the "E" spelling of the name, although in another part of the Bible it is spelled with the "O" spelling. Actually the name G. W. Weldon listed on the first page uses the convential "O" spelling.

The second interesting point is the names of the children of George Washington Weldon. The first William A is William Alexander Weldon or Uncle Billy as he was more affectionately known. He was a farmer by trade but was well known over Shelby County for his love of Gospel Music and wherever a singing was held, Uncle Billy would be there to participate. William Alexander married Matilda Inzer and they had seven children.

The next, Johnathan H. Weldon would be Johnathan Henry Weldon. Henry as he was known was a merchant and a farmer. Along with the next brother Reece, they operated a store for a number of years at Weldon town (Shelby County) Alabama. He married Minerva Daniels and they had four children. Minerva Daniels died October 1, 1894 and Henry married Lula Jacobs.

The next name Reza G. Weldon is Reece Gideon Weldon. He was generally called Reece although several spellings were used such as Reece, Reza and Reece. He was a farmer and a merchant along with Henry Weldon at Weldon town. He also served as postmaster of Weldon town 1887-1888. Around 1889 he moved his family to Wilsonville Alabama and went into the mercantile business there. Reece married Eliza Ann Adams and they had five children.

George A. M. Weldon is George Andrew Weldon. It is not known what

the M in the name is for Andrew as he was called graduated from Atlanta College of Physicians and Surgeons in 1882, and engaged in the practice of medicine around Weldon town. He used a surry to make his calls and later this surry was used by Dr. Boyer of Wilsonville to make his calls. George Andrew married Lula Sims and they had three children. I am told by Dr. Weldon Ray, a grandson of George Andrew, that he has Dr. Andrew's diploma in his office in Bessemer Alabama.

The next, Mahala Ann Weldon is one that none of the family seems to know much about. A daughter of William Alexander (Annie Weldon Williamson) remembered the name but she thought she might have been a sister to George Washington Weldon. She further says that Mahala Ann might have married a Shirley or a Baker.

The last name is Leticia Weldon a daughter who died young. As I had the name from members of the family the spelling was Leticia. She could be the "sweet little girl" that Reece was referring to with the gravel sled.

Nothing is known of the family (brothers and sisters) of George Washington Weldon. There was one brother, Jack Weldon, who never married and was living with Henry Weldon at the time of his death. He is buried in the Old Liberty Cemetary in Shelby County. Mrs. Ellen Bradley of Atlanta Georgia says she remembered two men visiting Henry Weldon that she thinks might have been brothers to George Washington Weldon. There are several names that come up in connection with the family of George Washington Weldon and with the Culbertson family. There might have been a girl, a sister of George W. Weldon or his wife Martha Culbertson, named Sally. Also the name Melinda was recalled. As previously mentioned, the names of Dave Baker and W. D. Shirley as marrying one of these girls.

Of the Culbertson family there was a brother of Martha named Butler Culbertson. Reece spoke of him in his writing. There might have been another named Washington or Washburn. Some one remebers hearing of Uncle Wash Culbertson. I find a Washington Culbertson who married a Mary Washburn in St. Clair County Alabama but it appears the Culbertsons were in Georgia after 1850.

Of George Washington Weldon nothing is known of the date or place of his birth. He died in Shelby County in 1883. Someone said he was killed by a horse but this could very well be Mr. Hix (Burl Hix or Hicks) that Reece was writing about. I have in my possession a photostat copy of the Confederate Service Record of George Washington Weldon. This has been copied and is a part of this book.

It has been mentioned that certain names are familiar in other branches of the Weldon family. I have talked and corresponed with various branches in the South and generally some of the same names are mentioned. For Instance in Birmingham Alabama there is a Grayson W. Weldon whose grandfather was George Andrew Weldon. As yet I have been able to make no connection with this family and the George Andrew, son of George Washington Weldon. Also several of the Weldon families have prevailing names such as James, William and John, yet

no connection has been established between families.

There are or have been at least four town in the U.S. named Weldon or some variation of the name. Weldon North Carolina was named for Samuel Weldon as has been mentioned. At one time there was a postoffice at Weldontown Alabama. There is also a Weldon Springs Mo. and a Weldon Texas.

As you can see from this book the Weldon clan is evidently very large although the name might not be as common as Jones or Smith. I have listed throughout this several hundred names that are not connected with the Samuel Weldon family of North Carolina. Some of these could be duplicates, however the variety of names and locations of families is such that it is assured the Weldon family is a reasonably large group.

There are Weldons located through the South and in other parts of the country. Some I have talked to and some I have corresponded with. There are Weldons or their descendants in Alabama, Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Iowa, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Montana, North Carolina, Oregon, Ohio, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Texas, Tennessee and Virginia, so it appears the Weldon family is scattered throughout the country.

There are several other records of earlier Weldon names that I cannot properly connect. From Early records of Shelby County marriages I find the following information: Armand M. Weldon mar. John Kanady 1-19-1865; Margaret Weldon mar. Leonard Bullock 5-14-1865; Mary Weldon mar. John Brashire 10-6-1851; Rena Weldon mar. Issac Littleton 2-21-1861. I have not seen these names in connection with the Shelby County Weldons. The Census of 1820 list no Weldons in Shelby County. The earliest records of Weldons in Alabama I can find is a Benjamin Weldon living in Bruntin Parish in 1747 or 1748.

In the State of Georgia in 1861 an outfit called "Wiregrass Rifles" was organized. From its rolls I obtained the following information; S. J. Weldon enlisted Sept 7. 1861; John Weldon enlisted Sept. 7, 1861, killed Shapoburg Md. Sept. 17, 1867; Issac Weldon, Brooks County Georgia, enlisted Sept. 7, 1861; D. J. Weldon, enlisted Sept. 7, 1861.

The name Weldon is used for a first name and middle name by some of the descendants of the female Weldons. I have encountered persons who had Weldon as a given name but unable to find the origin of the name.

It is also known that there are colored persons by the name of Weldon. Of course a great majority of the Negroe names are derived from the families that owned them as slaves. I find no trace or listing of Weldons as owners of slaves. This is a very difficult thing to trace, in fact old records list only the number of slaves owned by a family.

The Weldons listed I have met personally about 50 of these and have talked by telephone or corresponded with about 50 others, which

still leaves a number of persons that may furnish information about the Weldon family. In the information I have and keep on the Weldon family are bits of information which do not as now fit into the picture as I have it. For instance the town of Dalton Georgia and Harris County Georgia have been mentioned in connection with the family, the name of Issac Weldon in Alabama, and Indian blood in the family. These are samples of the information that has been gathered, but nothing has been established to substantiate this information.

There are a number of families connected with the Weldon family by marriage. A number of these are to be found in Shelby County Alabama. I have done some research on part of these but at the present the best information I have is on the Wilder family which dates back also to England.

This material has been prepared on a "piece part" method and rather than rewrite the above information I will add to it if new information comes in before the book is completed and printed. I am following this method because part of the masters for printing this information has been completed.

Information has been received from a Bernard Katz, 3756 Bellevue Road, Toledo 13, Ohio who married Jewell Gurmælle Weldon. He writes he has been tracing the Weldon family of Georgia for nearly 18 years. As yet there is no connection between the two families, but some of the information he has agrees with what has already been written and some is entirely new. His listing of some 219 descendants of the family of William Welden (1770-1867) Mar. Rebecca Gill (1775-1853), are listed later.

The following paragraph is from information obtained from Mr Katz. As you will note some of the information is exactly as I have it and some gives additional information..

Welden is an English name, coming from two Anglo Saxon words, "Weald", meaning forest and "den" meaning valley. This is the original and true spelling for Welden. They probably migrated to America from Lecestershire England, where there many marriage and other records for this name from 1600 on (I have some). Certain "come-overers" by Crapo list a William Welden who came over in the "Bona Nova" in 1619, was living in Virginia in 1624. One Peter Welden was brought to Virginia in, 1645 by Robert Eyers and Company.

He has further information on Samuel Weldon of Weldon North Carolina which trace the family back to England, and is listed later. Again I would caution the reader that the William Weldon, father of George Washington Weldon is assumed to be a son of Samuel Weldon, based on the writings of Reece Weldon and what has been remembered by older members of the family. As yet there is no direct proof of this connection. Once this connection has been established and proven then the Weldon line for this branch will be complete to its English ancestors. As far as descendants listed in this book are concerned it will be assumed that the information is correct and will be listed as such.

I have hopes that the family I have traced and the family of Mr. Katz can be connected, which will give us a good line of descendants of Weldon. I would like to urge the reader of this book to send all corrections, additions and any other information to either Mr. Katz or myself so that it might be possible to complete the family line for future generations.

WILDER FAMILY

For information to interested families such as the descendants of Recce Gideon Weldon or the family of Alice Weldon, a remarkable book on the widely distributed Wilder family has just been completed and published by Mr. William Murtha Wilder of Albany Georgia. This book contains the names of some 18,000 Southeastern People in a nicely organized fashion.

This line starts with Edward Wilder who brought the name to the Virginia Colony about 1648 or his brother Francis, who landed in the Maryland Colony about the same time. Through them he has established their genealogical connection to that Nicholas Wylder who brought the name to England in the Norman Invasion of 1485. He also has similar information on nearly 4,000 Wares, descending from the Six Early Settlers in the South Carolina and Georgia Colonies, and how they relate to each other and to their earliest Ancestors in the Virginia Colony; and through them, to their English origins.

I had the honor of helping Mr. Wilder collect the information on the Albama Wilder Line which included some 400 to 500 persons. This is Mr. Wilders second book on the Wilder Line, his first containg some 7,000 descendants.

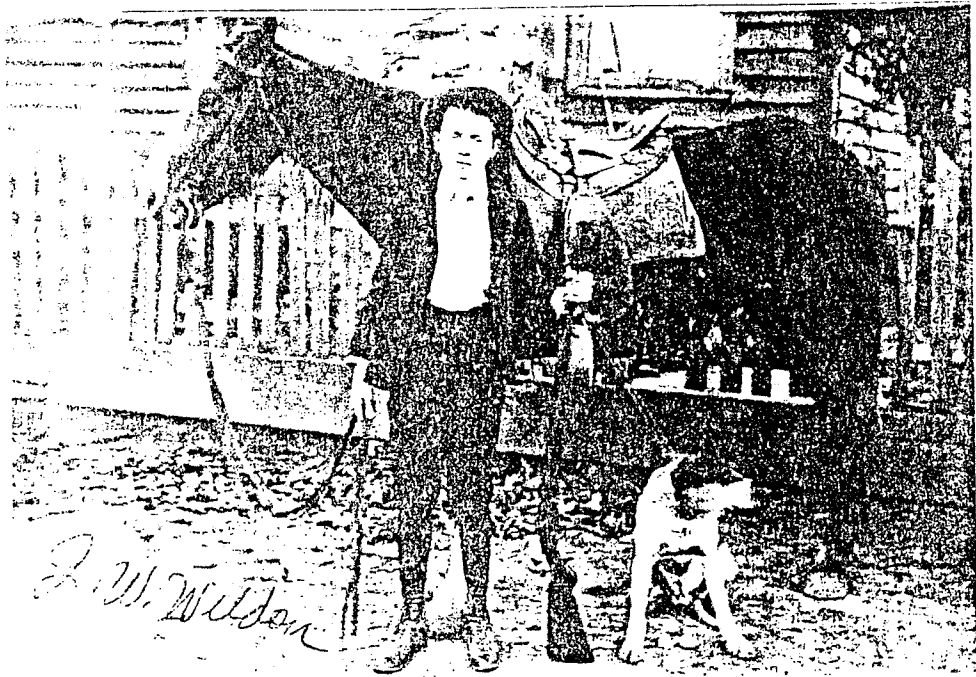
