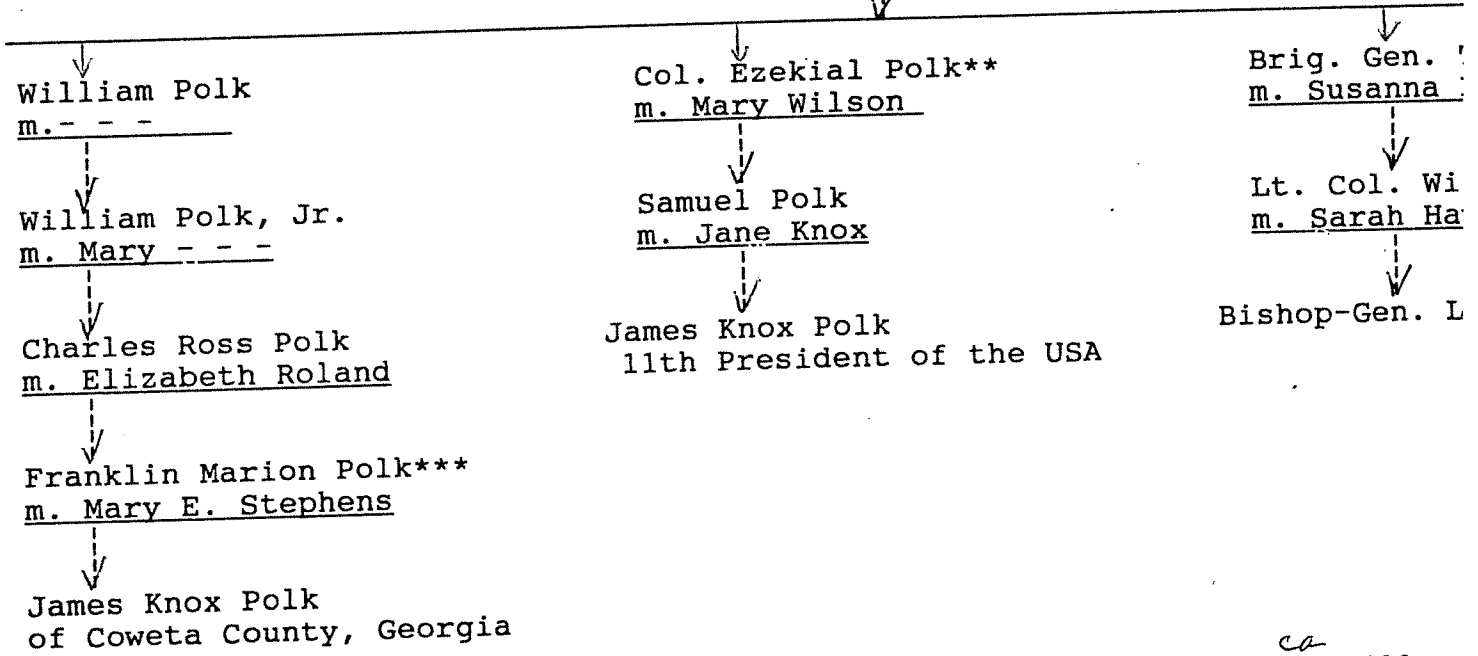

## FRANKLIN MARION POLK

Franklin Marion Polk and family moved from Coweta County, Georgia, to Cook Springs, St. Clair County, Alabama in the late 1870s. He was a sixth generation descendent of Robert Bruce and Magdalene Tasker Porter Pollock, immigrants from County Donegal, Ireland to Maryland in the mid 1600s. The Polk spelling was used by all succeeding generations, which were: William, William, William, William Jr., Charles Ross and Franklin Marion.

The third William was a brother of the illustrious Polks of Revolutionary War fame in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina. Charles Ross was a second cousin of President James K. Polk and Bishop-General Leonidas Polk.

Franklin Marion (03/24/1829-02/01/1922) was born in Madison County, Georgia and while young was taken to Catoosa County, Georgia. He went later to live with relatives in Tennessee for schooling. Returning to Georgia, he was employed by Elisha Stephens as the overseer on a plantation near Grantville in Coweta County and married on 09/19/1854 the oldest daughter, Mary Elizabeth Stephens (04/22/1835-01/15/1921). She had the responsibility for medical treatment of the family, slaves and the livestock. Medicinal herbs, poultices, teas and other home remedies were practiced. The children from that union were: Elizabeth (10/15/1855), James Knox (10/02/1857-05/26/1925), Susy (d. in infancy), Elisha Brown (01/01/1860-01/11/1900), Sarah Frances (02/20/1866-12/06/1942), George Washington (05.25/1868-12/27/1898) Dora Ann (04/21/1870-09/15/1935), Cora Selina.

(07/25/1872-03/23/1958), Charles Ross (11/15/1875-1962), Nancy Roberta (07/28/1879-04/02/1968), Franklin Marion (.06/02/1883-10/30/1965). The first five children were born in Coweta County, Georgia and the rest at Cook Springs, Alabama.

Franklin Marion Polk enlisted March 11, 1862 as a private in Company B, 1st Reg't, Georgia Cavalry for duty in the Confederate Army. He was captured January 27, 1864 at Pigeon River, Tennessee and taken to the infamous Rock Island, Ill Prison. He was sent to Camp Lee, Va. March 1, 1865 with pneumonia and was discharged there at the end of the war.

The devastation found upon his return home lead him and members of the Stephens family to look for a more favorable place to start over. He bought land two miles northeast of Cook Springs. Trees were marketed for lumber and used for building a new home when land was cleared for cultivation. The Polk s lived there the remainder of their days. Membership in the Cook Spring Baptist Church lasted until their deaths. Burial was in the Cook Spring's Cemetary

Franklin M. Polk (b. 24 Mar. 1829-d. 1 Feb. 1922) Private, Company B, First Regiment, Georgia Cavalry, C.S.A.

Franklin Marion Polk, was a descendent of the Polks from Mecklenburg County, North Carolina. These Polks were leaders in promulgating the Mecklenburg Declaration that preceded the Revolutionary War.

The Polk family is a branch of Pollocks, minor royalty in Scotland, who moved to Ireland. Decendents moved from Ireland to Maryland's eastern shore in the late 1600s or early 1700s. William Polk moved from Maryland to Pennsylvania, and his son Thomas moved to North Carolina in 1753. Ezekial, Thomas' brother, came to North Carolina later and helped organize Mecklenburg County. Ezekial's son, Samuel, was the father of James K. Polk, eleventh president of the United States.

Franklin Marion Polk, the son of Charles Ross and Elizabeth (Betsy) Roland Polk, was born 24 March 1829 in Madison County, Georgia. The son of a farmer, his youth was spent in agricultural pursuits.

As a young man, Franklin lived, for awhile, with the Polk relatives who had moved from North Carolina to Middle Tennessee, and in the later years of his life told many interesting stories to his grandchildren of his experiences with these members of President James K. Polk's family.

When he returned to Georgia he was employed as overseer on the farm of Mr. John Stephens in Coweta County. He and Mary Elizabeth Stephens later married. Although Mr. Stephens owned many slaves and Franklin supervised their labor, he was so opposed to slavery that he would not accept any slaves as a gift nor allow his bride to keep her former personal slave. Two sons, James Knox and Elisha were born in 1858 and 1860, respectively.

Franklin Marion Polk enlisted from Coweta County in the Confederate Army 4 March 1862 as a Private in Company B, First Regiment, Georgia Cavalry. He saw much service with that unit until his capture by Union forces at Pigeon River in east Tennessee 27 January 1864. War records show he was sent first to Camp Chase, Ohio, then to the military prison at Louisville, Kentucky, and finally on 18 February 1864 to the military prison at Rock Island, Illinois. On 2 March 1865 he left the Rock Island prison and on 9 March 1865 he entered Jackson Hospital in Richmond, Virginia with pneumonia. Then on 13 March 1865 he entered Camp Lee, Virginia.

Following his release after the end of the hostilities he returned to Coweta County and resumed his farming activities. Then about 1870 he moved his wife and four children (James K., Elisha, Sarah and George J.) to Alabama. They settled on Cane Creek near Cook Springs in St. Clair County and began a new extensive farming operation. Five more children born after this move included Dora, Cora, Charles, <sup>Roberta</sup>~~Nancy~~ and Franklin M. Jr.

Franklin M. Polk was a leader in the Cook Springs community and a staunch member of the Cook Springs Baptist Church. He continued to live on his farm with Franklin, Jr. until his death 1 February 1922. He was interred in the church cemetery.

## II. GENERAL REPORT POLK

### Polk

This is a Scottish place name originally spelled Pol-lanlocka and later Polloch, Pulloc and Pollock. The meaning is "Loch-poll" — a body of water formed by a natural depression of the land.

Those bearing the surname probably acquired it by living at such a place or on the lands of Pollock (same meaning) in Renfrewshire. On an old map of Renfrewshire the spelling was *Pook* and that was the common pronunciation in the area.

Peter, son of Fulbert, was granted the lands of Upper Pollock around 1170 and took his surname from them. In 1178, as Peter de Pullock, he witnessed a charter by King William the Lion. Around 1230, his daughter Murie de Pollock gave her land to the hospital of Spey. Thomas le (of) Polloc was a witness to several charters between 1234 and 1272. Around 1260 Robert de Polloc granted 12 pennies yearly from his rentals to the monastery of Paisley on the condition that he and his heirs receive some of the benefits of the prayers of the monks.

Peres de Pollok of Lanarkshire and John Pollok of Forfarshire rendered homage to the English crown in 1304. John Pullok, a merchant, was given a safe conduct pass into England in 1453. Sir Thomas Polloc was a witness in Glasgow in 1473. Nile Pook was a servitor to the bishop of Aberdeen in 1549. Mariota Pook was the wife of John Watsoun of Edinburgh in 1632. John Pollike was an animal skinner in Edinburgh in 1678.

Burke's General Armoiry describes the Pollock and Pollok arms.

JAMES KNOX Polk, eleventh president of the United States, was a great-grandson of Robert Polk or Pollok who emigrated from Ayrshire to this country.

Other spelling variations are Palk, Paulk, Polk, Polke, Pollock, Pollok and Paulke.

Reference to the Angelotti articles and to the book, "Polk Family and Kinsmen" (see bibliography) will show that there was an additional son of 3 William Polk of Maryland, Pennsylvania and North Carolina: 4 William Polk. This William was evidently the oldest child of 3 William and his wife Margaret Taylor. With a probable birthdate of about 1725, 4 William could have been a bit too old (he would have been eight years older than General Washington) to have served in the war with his brothers Charles, Thomas, John and Ezekiel, except perhaps in the militia.

4 William Polk is found in various North Carolina records 1757-1802, in the Mecklenburg area, but as of this year (1979) records of his estate have not been found. This is evidently one reason for so little having been written about his family during 150-odd years of Polk research. All the other "Mecklenburg brothers" left wills for posterity.

Some sources, including the various "Polk Family Trees" found in the vertical files of many libraries and archives, maintain that 4 William Polk was twice married. The names of his wives have not been found, but references of marriages to "a Spratt", "a Campbell", "a Barnett" and others have been noted and checked out. These same sources identify four sons of 4 William Polk: 4-i Thomas, 4-ii John, 4-iii Ezekiel, and 4-iv William Jr. Research seems to confirm that these four were likely sons of 4 William, although few public records were found on 4-iii Ezekiel.

It was determined from public records that the Georgia branch of Polks was headed by one William Polk and his wife Mary, who were found in the area of northeast Georgia that is now Madison County, early in the 19th century. Their oldest known son, Ezekiel, was shown to have been born in North Carolina in 1782. Their second son, Charles, was likewise born in North Carolina, in 1784. From these dates, it was logical to assume that William was born about 1760 and married Mary about 1780 or 1781. The birthdate for William is consistent with census records.

Further research in the records of North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Tennessee, Arkansas, Mississippi, Texas, Missouri, Pennsylvania and Maryland resulted in considerable amounts of new Polk data. This new information has been incorporated in the attached Summary of the Polks of North Carolina and Tennessee.

Some of the work involved the elimination of all those William Polks of record, born approximately 1740-1770, as possible sons of 4 William Polk. The exception was William Polk of Georgia, who was then designated 4-iv William Polk. This is the conclusion of several Polk researchers.

The foregoing allowed the establishment of the following direct line of Polks:

3 William Polk, 4 William Polk, 4-iv William Polk, 4-iv-2 Charles Ross Polk, 4-iv-2-iii Franklin Marion Polk, and 4-iv-2-iii-1 James Knox Polk. The latter is the gf of clients Mrs. Thomas and Mrs. Miller.

The following simple chronology which includes places of residence and migrations might help to show continuity of this line (dates approximate):

1811-1814 in Madison County Ga. records (Madison formed partially from Franklin in 1811). He is listed as a surveyor.  
1815 in Pendleton District, S.C. records  
(he stayed about one year, living near Levi Phillips Sr., whose daughter Betsy married William's son Ezekiel)  
1816 in Jackson County, Ga. records  
1817 in Hall County, Ga. records (Hall formed from Jackson)  
1818-1825 in Cape Girardeau County, Mo. records  
(the impetus for this migration is not quite clear, although during this period public lands in the Louisiana Territory were open for settlement; some of the Bollingers migrated from N.C. about 1810)  
1830-1839 in Madison County, Mo. records

Note: Last record found was dated 1839. The estate records of 4-iv William Polk have not yet been found. In "Polk Family and Kinsmen", grandson Charles K. Polk of Iron County, Mo. stated that he had no recollection of his grandfather. Charles K. was born 16 Oct. 1839.

 The bane of family history researchers is missing, incomplete or inaccurate records. People of the old days had no idea that their descendants would be "looking them up", otherwise they would have taken more care in their record-keeping. Yet, it is easy for us to shift the blame to these pioneers; they had other, more pressing, problems.

Many county courthouses were burned, destroying part or all of the record Clerks and others neglected to file information. Only a chosen few were literate; inaccuracies were common. Even records kept by the family were sometimes suspect, as they depended on the memories of individuals.

Given all this, it would be a miracle if every name and vital statistic in this Summary were accurate. Some of the data have been approximated by logical interpretation of available records. Additions and corrections are therefore welcome, and may be submitted to the undersigned.

It is expected that selected copies of public records accumulated during the research period will be filed in the Polk Genealogical Folder at the Georgia State Archives, 330 Capitol Avenue, Atlanta, Georgia 30334. Our thanks to the Polk research exchange group for their contributions.
