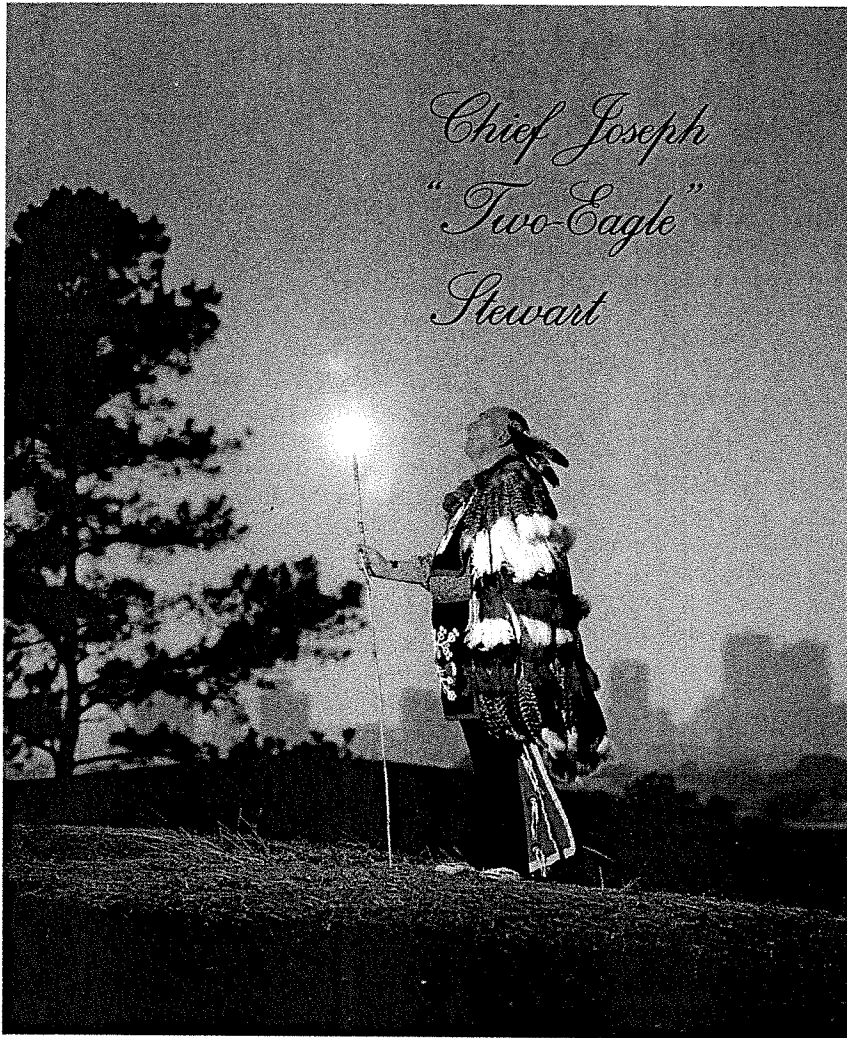

■ It was against the law in Alabama to be a free-roaming Indian when Cherokee Chief Joseph "Two-Eagle" Stewart was growing up in what is now Cahaba Heights. In the 1930s, if you didn't want to live on a reservation you had to go underground and hide a proud heritage.

As a young boy, Joseph Stewart might have learned nothing of his true background but for an uncle who was determined to fulfill a tribal obligation of extended family members caring for and teaching the young.

"My grandfather died when I was one, so it fell to my father's oldest brother, Ed, to educate me. He lived in Tuscaloosa, but he would travel all the way to New Murkle on weekends to teach me tribal beliefs. Up until then I had been taught that being an Indian was a deep, dark secret. My parents taught me it was a bad thing to be an Indian...something to be ashamed of."

When Stewart got out of the armed services, he went to work for the Vestavia Hills police department. He continued hiding the fact that he

was a Native American.

"I'd tint my hair to lighten it and stay out of the sunshine. I used an old Indian formula of mixing lemon juice and buttermilk to lighten my skin. There were a lot of tricks you could use, but the main thing was to wear a long sleeved shirt and keep it buttoned up and to wear a hat to keep the sun off your face. The sun darkens Cherokees into a distinctive coppery-red.

"I wasn't even a citizen of the United States (Indians became citizens in 1968) when I became a police officer. I worked my way up through the ranks and retired as chief of the department...they never knew I was an Indian.

"When my retirement came through and the papers were signed and it was all official, I went before the city council and told them. All their jaws hit the table, but there wasn't a thing they could do about it."

Stewart's retirement as chief of police marked the beginning of a new life mission, one that would keep him and wife Charlotte fully occupied and make him a chief again.

"Our goal was, and is, for Indian people to have confidence and hope again. Education is the key to that goal. One of the Cherokee traditions Ed taught me was that life is a place of learning and a life without knowledge is nothing, but in a life filled with knowledge all things can be achieved. Before we could help educate our people, though, we had to get them to come out of hiding, and that took some doing.

Under Joe and Charlotte's direction, the Cherokee education program in Alabama has become one of the best in the nation. But

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educating their own people is just part of the Stewarts' goal. They are also determined to educate non-natives about the true nature of Native Americans. The issue of Indian archeological digs is particularly vexing to Stewart.

"I don't care if it is 1991, we still have to change a lot of attitudes. One thing this country could use today is more Indians. Because to be an Indian is not a matter of bloodline or skin color. It's a way of looking at the world and the people in it.

"Power in most dominant cultures is based on material possessions. That doesn't mean a thing to a true Indian. Power in our culture is based on service to your people. Our chiefs were always the poorest in the tribe. They gave everything away to those who needed it." —**Larry Ragan**

later, there is rarely any widespread criticism of the changes.

"Dr. Hammonds was criticized but he stuck to his guns. I like that about him," says board member Ormie McAlpin. "He loves people. He doesn't close up. He interacts well with people, and he listens." Since arriving in Birmingham, Hammonds has plunged into the city.

"Schools are an integral part of the community. We have to support and encourage each other," Hammonds says. "Problems in our communities effect our schools, but successes in schools can have a positive impact on our communities."

The 54-year-old Louisiana native has spent all of his career as a public school educator in classrooms, as a counselor and as an administrator.

Before coming to Birmingham, Hammonds was superintendent of schools in Durham, North Carolina. In that city, school board members and city officials credited him with rekindling interest, morale, and faith in a school system that was on a decline before he took on the job. Birmingham school board members were hoping he would have a similar impact on this system.

"I believe in commitment. When I accepted this job, I said I wanted to help this system develop into one that could be a model for others. I'm committed to this goal, and that commitment means something." —**Denise Stuart**

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STEWART, STEWARD, STUART family history

In the early 1700s William Stewart, a native of Dumfries, Scotland, jumped ship and swam ashore near Charleston, S.C. and made his way to Virginia. He married a girl from Penn Co. in 1725.

John Stewart, son of William, was born 1730 in Goochland, Virginia. He was a General in the Revolutionary War. He married Ann Haw (Indian), and lived in Hanover and Cumberland Co. Virginia, then Amherst Co. where he died in 1784. She moved to Georgia and died there.

John Stewart Jr. born 1758 in Virginia. He married Mourning Floyd (Indian). John served in the Revolutionary War and War of 1812. He died 23 April 1829.

John Richard I. P. Stewart, son of John Jr. was born in Bedford Co., Virginia. The NC/Va Piedmont area. The family later moved to Georgia. In the 1800s he left Georgia, with his children, wife and one slave.

In 1850 John R. and his family, with the exception of Jeremiah and Richard, his sons, were found in Benton Co. Alabama. (Now Calhoun County). Later he crossed Ohanafeefee Gap and settled at Stewart's Crossroads, Alabama. The Ohanafeefee Village stood where Camp Winnataska now stands.

His son, Jeremiah was born 17 June 1826 in Georgia. He served in the Seminole War of 1835-42 and was mustered out of service in Florida with the pay of two mules. In 1850 he married Malinda Jane, a Seminole born 1830 in S. Carolina, and returned to Ohanafeefee Village. Jeremiah was probably about 14 when he

went to the Seminole War. He also fought in the Civil War. He served as a Private with Co. "H" "30" Ala. Infantry. It was organized at Talladega, Ala. in April 1862. The 30th took part in the fights at Tazewell and Cumberland Gap, and went into Kentucky; then was sent to Mississippi, fought at ^{Port} / Gibson, May 1, 1863, with severe loss, making a brilliant record there and at Baker's Creek; it was captured when Vicksburg fell, after suffering untold hardships.

When paroled it recruited and joined the Army near Chattanooga. It fought at Rocky Face and at Resaca, and was in the van of the army in Tennessee campaign of the fall and winter of 1864.

At New Hope, May 1864; Atlanta; July 22nd, and Jonesboro the regiment lost heavily. There is where Jeremiah was captured on 5 Sept. 1864. He was turned over to the Army of the Cumberland on 8 Sept. 1864. He had been with Gen. Pettus Brigade, Stevenson Division, Lee Corps. He was sent to the Military Prison at Louisville, Kentucky; then sent to Camp Douglas, Ill. 29 Oct. 1864. He was captured by forces under Maj. Gen. W.T. Sherman commanding Military Division of the Mississippi. On 16 May 1865 Jeremiah was discharged when he signed an oath of allegiance to the U.S.

Jeremiah and Malinda are buried in Stewart Cemetery near their old home place on Ohanafeefee Gap Road, off old hwy. 78 E. of Leeds. The log structure (longhouse) was destroyed by fire, along with the family Bible which listed all the Indian names of John Stewart's decendents. Jeremiah was later a carpenter, along with his farming. He and Malinda had 10 children -- only 6 lived. Jeremiah died 16 Feb. 1901 and Malinda died 7 March 1915. Malinda gave the land where Mineral Springs Methodist Church was built. (Later burned)

Children of Jeremiah and Malinda Jane Stewart:

1. Sarah - b. 1851 m; Archibald Patrick Spruiell. He was born 1853 St.Clair Ala. died 1936-37. She died 1929. Both are buried in Dover Cem. Hill Co. Texas.
2. Caroline - b. 1853 St.Clair Co. Ala/
3. Richard Jones - b. 1855 M; Nancy Spruiell 18 Jan 1878. He was a preacher. They lived at Morris, Ala for a while but in 1910 were living with Malinda Jane at Stewart's Crossroads. He was hooked by a bull and killed. (Information by E.E Minor.)
4. Mary - b. 1857 M: _____ Collins. Had one son, One daughter. Son - Eldridge Collins, Leeds, Ala. Daug. Audry Collins Armstrong Leeds, Ala.
5. Dave W. - b. 1859 , was a Methodist Protestant preacher. He founded Century Methodist Church at Leeda, Ala. and Cahaba Heights Methodist at Birmingham, Ala. He became a full conference member (Methodist Church Conf.) in 1892. He died 1931, buried Cahaba Heights.
6. Mildera - b. 1861 St. Clair Co. Ala.
7. J.W.(Jep) - b. 1862 St. Clair Co. Ala.
8. James Thomas - b. 8 Aug 1865 d. 17 April 1924 Buried at Stewart's Crossroads, St. Clair Co. Ala. Stewart Cemetery.

One of the girls married a McLaughlin. All the Stewart children were born at Stewart's Crossroads, St. Clair County, Ala.

5 - Dave had a son Mack, He had a son Joseph. Joseph worked for the Vestavia Hills Police Dept in B'ham, Ala. He became chief of police but had to give it up because of his heart. He & wife Charlotte have 2 sons, David & Danny, live in Maylene, Ala. He is the Principle Chief of the Echota Cherokee Tribe of Alabama. His name is Two Eagles.

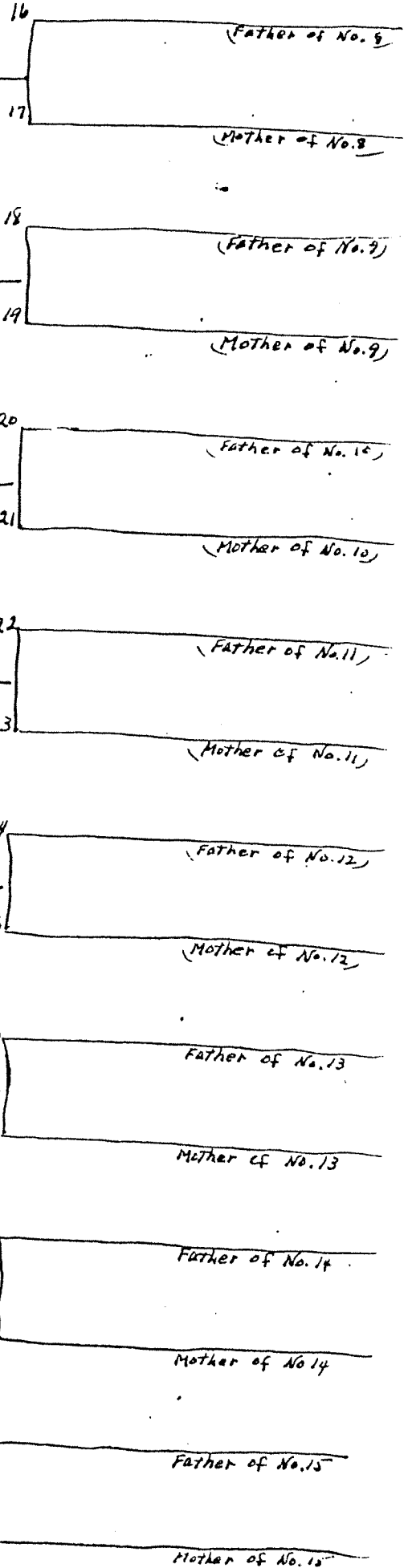
